### Shots for Tots: A Proud Rotarian Tradition

Last Tuesday evening Rotarians gathered at the First Presbyterian Church, as they had for the past 19 nineteen years, in support of “Shots for Tots,” a program that had provided free vaccinations to approximately 7,800 children. Last Tuesday was special because it marked the end of this noble and most Rotarian of programs.

A joint effort of our Club, the Lee County Health Department and First Presbyterian, ‘Shots for Tots’ began in January, 1995 and offered shots the first Tuesday of every month. A total of nearly 17,000 shots have been administered, including immunizations against polio, measles, chicken pox, and a dozen other ailments that threatened children’s health.

The program was begun at the request of the Children’s Services Council which asked the Rotary Club to help establish a clinic in the area because many families did not have access to local health providers. Shots for Tots is being discontinued because the Health Department will no longer have personnel available to provide these services outside their own facilities.

The guiding force behind Shots for Tots has always been **Ira Hawk**. Ira is an extraordinarily courageous and remarkable Rotarian. His compassionate, commitment to service embodies all it means to be Rotarian.

In 2006 Lee County celebrated “Ira Hawk Day.” Ira was honored during one of our Club meetings for his Shots for Tots service (shown left) and the Commissioner’s Resolution noted **“Ira’s keen understanding of the importance of childhood immunizations for all children has positively impacted the community of Bonita Springs and greater Lee County. The Rotary Club has made childhood immunizations a major focus, and Ira is on the front lines, spreading the word, helping to keep our community strong and healthy.”**




