"Investments that do not meet today's objectives should be changed"

Mark Generales and **Mark McCaw** set out to give us some information that we could use in our own investing.



Generales pointed out there are only two basic ways to invest your money:

Own something or **Loan** it to someone.

He emphasized that one nice thing about the stock market is you can always get

out. Other "Own something" investments may be difficult to liquidate when you need to. However, the stock market Specialist is required to maintain the market in his stocks so you can always sell.

One problem investors face is making changes in investments as conditions change. The principal reasons for not changing are not paying attention; sentiment; false hopes; and/or lack of knowledge.

He says, "There are plenty of opportunities in the market today depending on the risks you are willing to take...in my career, since 1978, every market decline has been followed by an increase. I've been hearing 'yeah, but things are different now'. I've been hearing this for 38 years and yet everytime 'they are different' the results turn out very much the same."

Mark McCaw went to the easel to give us some advice about the practical limits of "diversification" and refresher course in Statistics 1/2.

It is pretty well known that owning one stock has a significantly higher risk of loss than holding 10-20 different stocks. Statistically, the risk continues to become less up to



about 27 different stocks. Holding more than 27 does not reduce risk further. He says "80% of mutual funds do not outperform their index before fees". Given that, then the disadvantage of mutual funds is they almost always underperform and their trading activities may create undesirable tax consequences.

Mark then went back to the easel to demonstrate some applicable statistics. Over the long term the S&P average has returned about 8%. The standard deviation of returns is 12%. Statistically, this says that 2/3's of the time the returns have been between -4% and +20%, and 96% of the time between -16% and +32%. This analysis can be applied to different classes of ones investments to quantify the potential risk.

successful. There have been two applications, another promised and four other prospects.




Bob Lombardo came forward to urge signups for the upcoming Nautical Flea Market, March 18, 19, 20. This is a joint venture

George praised the Rotary Regulars who work hard and get behind the club's activities. "We appreciate all of you."































VOCATIONAL SERVICE MOMENT
