Last Week Program

Peter O'Flinn introduced our Speaker, Rick Gallo, a volunteer with the Make-A-Wish Foundation who is Chair of the West Coast (FL) President's Council. Rick and his wife Barb are owners of CloseWatch Services a home watch and cleaning services company. They have two grown daughters.



Rick and Barb have chaired the Walk For Wishes that grossed \$105,000 this year. The net was enough for about 20 wishes. Rick, as a charity auctioneer, has helped local charities raise \$3.1 million in the last year.

He says, "I would have been here more often if I knew you were going to sing and do shots."

The mission of Make-A-Wish is to grant the wishes of children with life-threatening medical conditions to enrich the human experience with hope, strength and joy. He says, "There is a misconception that we grant wishes only to dying children. The majority go on to lead productive lives."

Make-A-Wish was started in Phoenix in 1980, the Southern Florida chapter in 1983. It is now in 67 countries and is one of the most recognized charities in the world with a 4 star Charity Navigator rating. Over 265,000 wishes have been granted over the 36 years. This chapter has granted more than 10,000 wishes, one of only six chapters to have reached that mark.

Rick and Barb act as "wish grantors". They meet with the child to make certain the "wish" is actually what the kid wants, whatever they want to do, wherever they want to go, whomever they want to meet. "A young man from this area wanted to meet the Pope. We made it happen".

He says, "Medical professionals tell us, that when a kid is notified of receiving a wish, it gives them something to look forward to so they're going to fight a little harder to overcome their illness. It is one of the reasons they have pulled through and conquered their disease."

Finally, Rick says, "100 years from now it won't make any difference how big a house I owned, but if I can make a difference in the life of one child, then I can make the world a different place."
