

**Kae Moore** introduced our speaker, **Gary Price**, who needed no introduction. Gary had 40 years experience in local governments in 1 county and 3 cities. For 21 of those years he was City Manager of Sanibel and then Bonita Springs.

Gary started by offering "Gary's Fifteen Theorems". These are wise old sayings authored by others except for #7, "You only have so many arrows in your quiver so do not waste them on meaningless issues."

He is an able raconteur, but limited his stories to his early years and claiming the "statute of limitations" did not allow him to tell tales about his dealings with the Mayor and Council in Bonita.

Gary points out that local government affects our daily quality of life directly; potholes, drainage problems, trash pickup, mosquitos, ambulance service, etc. are all issues controlled by local governments.

Gary's second job was working for Hillsboro County helping to implement county-wide zoning. On a hot summer night, Gary was giving a presentation in a not airconditioned hall in Wimauma to a group of tired, hard working locals.

After the meeting, Gary asked his assistant why he didn't come up front with Gary. "They were talking about lynching you and I wanted to be near the door."

Gary told about the Sanibel Council that was anxious to do "something", in this case enact a dog control ordinance.

His position was there was no real need since the local alligators were very effective in controlling the dog population. However, Council adopted the ordinance.

The first dog picked up, \$100 fine, you guessed it, belonged to one of the Councillors.

Gary concluded with this summary of his career, "Some of it was exciting, some of it was disturbing, and frankly I'm glad I'm retired."


#### 10 Years ago
