Last Week Program

Marjorie Rubacky introduced our speaker Teri Lamaine, Executive Director of the Bonita Springs Assistance Office.

The Bonita Springs Assistance Office has served the greater Bonita Springs area since 1979, helping ordinary people who encounter temporary financial hardships. The agency works to foster independence and self-reliance through education and by bridging financial needs such as rent, mortgage, utilities, clothing, food or health expenses. BSAO is a United Way partner and maintains a food pantry, provides money management classes and makes referrals to other social service organizations.



Teri has been a Southwest Florida resident since 1991 and has been active in the Bonita Springs community since 2000. She and husband, **Dale Timple** were honored as Citizens of the Year by the Chamber of Commerce.

Teri and Dale co-own T Squared Renovations Inc., a Bonita Springs general contracting company, specializing in residential and commercial renovations since 2011. She has professional experience as a patient care coordinator and in sales and marketing in the hospitality industry, including a 10 years as national sales manager with The Naples Beach Hotel & Golf Club.

She told us of some of the support the BSAO brought to the city's residents in the flooded area behind CVS starting after Labor Day before Hurricane Irma. BSAO brought a mobile pantry and 250 catered meals to the Flamingo Flea Market parking lot. The pantry had food as well as supplies needed to prepare for Irma.

On Friday, September 8th, BSAO partnered with CVS, and Bonita Community Health Center to get 35 individuals their necessary medications and medical supplies to survive the storm.

Teri says, "Lot's of people assume we are city or state funded. I have to tell you, we get no money from city, no money from state, no money from federal government. We get all of our income from wonderful people like you and from special events."

There were 158 at the door on Thursday after the storm. The volunteers began processing FEMA applications. By the next Tuesday, thank you's were being received from people who had FEMA deposits in their bank accounts.

For the last six weeks BSAO has been open 7 days/week. RaceTrac donated gas for Bonita residents being housed at the Estero Recreation Center. Some residents were there for 46 days.

BSAO partnered with FEMA and 5 local hotels to get extended hotel vouchers for residents. "This is a very emotional time at BSAO. We still have folks who don't know where they are going to live."

Other partnering contributions have been made by Chico's, Rooms to Go, and local hotels. Local landlords forgave September rents, BSU and FPL are cooperating with hard pressed customers.

"There was an outpouring of donations from every part of the country. There were 10,000 pound deliveries every Saturday in October...We encourage people with our moto..**A Hand Up, Not a Hand Out.**"
