Sara started by telling us all that the primary disaster the Red Cross responds to is house fires. They also respond to tragedies such as Parkland and Sandy Hook but they choose not to capitalize on those things. The Red Cross also is the largest blood services agency in the country, does first aid training, and services to Armed Forces. Sara's Red Cross story took her around the world. Then, she met Kathy Flynn who was doing a presentation on the measles and rubella initiative. Sara then went on a trip to Kenya, vaccinating 19 million children in 10 days! It takes 1 to 1 1/2 years to set up a campaign of this magnitude. This was what Sara was meant to do with her life.



She is an independent monitor—a volunteer and she is self funds—she pays for her own trips—airfare and hotels. Sara writes a report and can report problems in real time, like a cooler with melting ice. In Indonesia, 35 million children were vaccinated.
