# Last Week's Program: "A Profile of Service"

Last week, our good friend

Steve Agius offered an inspiring presentation on the meaning and impact of Rotarian service as he reported



and updated us on Gift of Life and the Wheelchair Foundation initiative. Steve's Rotarian "dossier" is impressive and impeccable, as he currently serves as District Membership Chairman, President of the

Chairman, President of the Board of Gift of Life and Chair of the District Wheelchair Committee.

He offered a historical

overview of Gift of Life, a program offering life saving open heart surgeries to



children
whose
families
would
not
otherwise
have the
financial
means to
obtain
such

treatment. A Rotarian initiative starting in 1971, 71 Districts now have Gift of Life programs, allowing over

15,000 children to receive and enjoy their "gift of life."

Our own District program began in 1997 and

since then has impacted the lives of 250 children.
Steve also offered an update on "mission training" and GOL's ability to maintain relationships with partner health care

institutions given today's economic climate. Steve announced that Jackson Memorial Hospital in Miami has agreed to take three GOL children this year.

Steve then turned his attention to the Wheelchair Foundation. Started in 2000, the Foundation's mission is to provide a wheelchair to every adult and child in the world who

needs one or can't afford one. District 6960

became



involved in 2002 and has actively supported the initiative since then. This program along with GOL offers wonderful opportunities to forge international partnerships. Thank you Steve for your tireless work in fostering those partnerships.
