RI reports that Rotarians in Côte d'Ivoire took part in National Immunization Days (NIDs). They joined thousands of health workers and volunteers in mobilizing public support, ensuring the safe delivery of the oral polio vaccine, and administering the life-saving drops to more than 3 million children. The nation's last case of polio occurred in July 2011. The NIDs also provided vitamin A supplements and de-worming tablets to children to expand public health benefits, which is another objective of the new polio endgame strategic plan.

Whether it is Côte d'Ivoire or Bonita Springs, Rotarians worldwide have a special bond with each other-living out the goal of service above self in all we do and in our own unique way.

> **Sandy Scoggins** briefed us on the Paul Harris Fellow program and other aspects of


