RI Reports--A \$500,000 Emergency Grant For Somalia

Rotary has approved a \$500,000 Rapid Response grant to the World Health Organization (WHO) to

address a recent polio outbreak in Somalia. The outbreak occurred in the Banadir region of Somalia, where a large number of children had not been vaccinated against polio due to inaccessibility.

As of 14 August, 110 cases of wild poliovirus have been reported in the Horn of Africa

—100 cases in Somalia and 10 in Kenya. This is the first outbreak in Somalia since 2007 and in Kenya since 2011.

The Rotary grant will cover operational costs, including human resources, training, and transportation of health workers, aimed at

stepped into the Member Spotlight last week. Born in Long Island, New York, Donna's family moved south to Tampa Bay area



where she graduated from Tarpon Springs High School. After stints in Atlanta and Charlotte, she returned to Florida and this area 15 years ago. Currently Membership Director of Colony Golf and Country Club, she noted the need "to get it right" because in the country club business one often sees the same people everyday.

Married for 21 years, she lives in Estero with her husband and three dogs. Travel is a passion for immunizing children under 10 in all accessible areas of Somalia in August.

To date, five vaccination campaigns have been held in Somalia, three in Kenya, two each in Ethiopia and Yemen, and one in Djibouti. Additional campaigns are planned through the end of the year.

Drawing on lessons learned from previous polio outbreaks, the first vaccination campaign was carried out within a week after the first case was

confirmed.

Rotary's emergency funding for responses to polio outbreaks in Somalia and other countries has been critical to ensuring that immunization activities proceed without interruption, thereby minimizing the risk of the disease's further international spread.

Donna, who has traveled to 21 countries so far. An avid reader, she also reported that she never leaves home without three things: her debit card, her cell phone, and her lipstick! Donna concluded her remarks reflecting on the importance of the 4 Way Test and how she has incorporated it into her work day. Thanks Donna for your presentation—we're glad you are member of our Club.
