can and should be implemented to garner energy conservation, reduce energy overhead, and maximize renewable energy





potential. Thanks Bill for a great and informative presentation.

Our Club has taken on a leadership role in organizing, developing, and nurturing the Rotaract

program at FGCU. As a tangible means of supporting academic excellence and professional development, we support a Rotaract Scholarship. Funded through our Club's Foundation, it available to any current FGCU student in good standing who is a member of the Rotaract Club. The award is currently \$1,000 per student and historically annual scholarship grants have ranged from \$2,000-\$6,000.
