Carl is returning to Rotary after a long absence. He had been a Rotarian for over 15 years serving as President of two separate clubs, one as Charter President, and is a Paul Harris Fellow. We welcome him to Rotary.

#### Last Week: Dr. Margaret Richardson



Joe Murgalo introduced Dr. Margaret Richardson, Head of School, Royal Palm Academy. Margaret Richardson has worked with the school since 1998, serving as Academic Dean, Principal, and Education Director.

Dr. Richardson has over 25 years experience in education, in the classroom, as an administrator, and as a curriculum developer.

Several of her professional development courses have been published. She obtained her Bachelor's Degree from SUNY at Albany, her Master's Degree from Georgia State University, and her Doctorate in Educational Leadership from the University of Phoenix.

Her topic was "Teaching for Success, School in the 21st Century". She pointed out the need for change when 1/3 of children drop out of high school. More than 1/2 of the drop-outs are African-Americans and Hispanics.

She believes we need to introduce innovative and creative ideas as we move from the "Information Age" to an economy and society built on the inventive, empathetic, big-picture capabilities--known as the "Conceptual Age."

She pointed out some gender differences in learning. Boys tend to mature more slowly than girls and are generally developmentally behind girls when first learning to read. Some boys decide reading is for girls. The begin their school career deciding they don't like to read.

Margaret believes that replacing middle schools with K-8 is a mistake. She thinks we need to have a middle school model that is something very different than elementary or high schools. This is an age group that is very vulnerable to experimentation in risky behavior and is not ready for the departmentalized approach of high schools. Once a risky path behavior has been adopted it is very difficult to change. One symptom of the failure is the high number of drop outs between 9th and 10th grades.

She discussed the trend to lengthening the school day. She said, "If programs are not working the way they are, just doing more of the same thing will not necessarily make them successful. We need to look at what we are doing in schools. If it isn't successful, what do we need to do to make it successful?"

Margaret expounded on the ideas of Dan Pink, author of *A Whole New Mind:* Why Right-Brainers Will Rule The Future.

Left-brain skills such as logical, linear, and sequential thinking are still necessary, but they are not sufficient.

Right-brain skills, such as simultaneous processing, contextual awareness, and synthesizing, are assuming a new and far greater importance.

The six abilities that will matter most in the forthcoming years are design, story, symphony, empathy, play, and meaning. Creating programs that will develop the six abilities is the critical need.
