Last Week: Fine Art Auctions



Grea Holtz introduced our speaker **Kristen** Vaughn of Leslie Hindman fine art auctioneers of Chicago and Naples. The top tier of auction houses consists o f Sotheby's and Christie's. These firms did \$4.9 billion of sales each last vear.

The next tier consists of about 5 houses considered middle market firms. Leslie Hindmanm is a middle market firm and is the largest in the Midwest.

An auction house is really a marketing firm. The job is to inventory, catalog, and categorize the items to be auctioned. The auction house takes items on consignment and charges a commission to both buyer and seller. In the business, "stuff" is a technical term.

The principal reasons for an auction result from **D**eath, **D**ivorce, **D**ebt, and now **D**ownsizing. Some people consider "Blue Chip" art and investment grade diamonds safe investments in these times of financial uncertainty in real estate and stocks.

The internet has changed the auction business by allowing people from all over the world to participate on-line and by phone including buyers from China. Chinese are the largest antique buyers in the world, representing about 30% of the business.

Kristen gave several examples of items selling at 2 to 10 times the pre-auction estimate. (Makes you wonder about the values given on "The Antiques Road Show".) One woman had items that sold for several hundred thousand dollars each. The woman had been a Walmart greeter. Kristen showed us a picture of herself with a Chinese vase that was sold by the Naples office for \$316,000.



This program was an interesting look at a rather different business. Kristen presented well and captured the rapt attention of the audience.


