Maria School of Law

The Center's mission is to provide a permanent sanctuary for orangutans and chimpanzees who have been rescued or retired from the entertainment industry, from research, or who are no longer wanted as pets. The Center provides care with dignity in a safe, healthy, and enriching environment for great apes in need of lifetime care.

Kevin described the origin of the Center. He was partner in a Miami full service law firm when a woman client came to his office with an orangutan in diapers. She explained that Fish and Game would no longer allow her to keep the orangutan and her chimpanzee in her condo, so she wanted to set up a non-profit organization to take care of them.

There are now 50 animals at the Center's facility in Wachula. Many are retired famous movie animals. The Center is supported by private donations and has an annual budget of \$1.4 million.
