Jon McCleod:

The Ride and The Gift of Life



Jon McCleod spoke to us about bicycling, his upcoming Boston to Key West bicycle ride, and the Gift of Life program. He described an accident he had in 2007 when he lost a battle with an F150 pickup truck. He is back to bicycling again after recovering from his injuries and overcoming his fear of riding.

He described the most common bike/auto accident, known as the Right Cross. It happens when a vehicle

enters an intersection, crossing from the right, over the cycling lane or road edge without looking for an oncoming cyclist.

Jon described the Boston to Key West trip as a "bucket list" item for him. It is a 1,900 mile trip that he wants to cover in 10-18 days. He is currently training 200 miles/week and now has gotten Brian Walton, an Olympian and World Champion, as a coach.

The Gift of Life is a Rotarians based program, not an RI program. There are now 71 programs throughout the world. The program provides treatment for children with congenital heart disease. So far 15,000 kids from 68 countries have been helped.

The traditional procedure was to bring kids to the U.S. at cost of \$5-10,000; stay at Rotarian's homes; have surgery locally; recover at Rotarian's homes; and return home after 4 or more weeks. Now, emphasis is shifting to trying to provide doctor training and outfitting surgery centers to do the surgery in the home country.

Jon has not set a goal for raising money for GoL from his trip. He is planning to speak at local Rotary Clubs each day. He is looking for sponsors and people who might make large donations and matching grant challenges. Naming rights are available. His blog is www.bos2kw.com. Spread the word.

Sandy asked for a cheer for **Claudie Feeney** and **Annette Dati** who are running in the New York Marathon on Sunday.


