Len Eckert announced that the Bonita Blues Festival had distributed \$7,500 each to the Golisano Children's Hospital, Bonita Assistance Office, and Music for Minors. To date the group has distributed more than \$98,000 to charities.

Dee Harris Nutrition for a Better Brain



Carol Johnson introduced our guest speaker Dee Harris, a Registered Dietitian, Certified Diabetes Educator, and nutrition and health consultant. Her consultancy, D-Signed Nutrition, develops special client relationships, engaging the body, mind and

spirit. They practice proactive, predictive, highly personalized counseling that empowers patients to take an active role in their wellness journey. The commitment is to engage for the long term by fine-tuning and adapting when necessary to keep the client healthy.

Dee gave us examples of how our processed food and eating habits may adversely affect our brains and bodies. She stressed the potential adverse effects of chemicals in food, GMO, hormones in meat and dairy, and statin drugs. She described us a country that is overfed and undernourished.

Dee suggested we can make healthy changes to our diets, add a good multivitamin, do routine blood work and test for food sensitivities, and reduce stress.
