The mission is to connect donors with the needs. In 2014, CFCC was overseeing more than 500 funds, collaborating with over 400 local nonprofits, and managing \$87 million in CFCC distributed assets.

The services provided by CFCC are educating people on charitable giving vehicles, customizing giving Tom Briers approaches, facilitating complex forms of giving, sharing knowledge on community needs, and helping people create personal legacies via named trusts.
