Last week Amy Pedagno visited us and offered insight and information on the importance and impact clinical programs have on legal education. A 2012

graduate of Ave Maria School of Law (summa cum laude) Amy has actively participated in the Asylum and Immigration Rights Law Clinic at Ave Maria.

A clinical program, Amy observed, can be thought of as a "specialized law firm," focusing on a specific area of the law. As such, one of the great advantages of clinical education is its ability to introduce students to practical skills that are very hard to teach in the abstract. Clinical education allows students the opportunity to interview clients, conduct legal research, develop legal strategies, and gain valuable courtroom experience.

Amy proceeded to describe her work in the Asylum and Immigration Rights Law Clinic at Ave Maria. She provided us with an overview of the immigration law system, insight into the types of cases the Ave Maria Clinic handles and her own personal experiences representing clients in this area.


