

Chad has become a friend of **Leroy Osceola**, a direct descendant of Chief Osceola of FSU mascot fame. Chief Osceola was captured and jailed in the 1830's and was displayed in a South Carolina jail as "the last of the savages."

Leroy is one of about 100 traditional natives living in Florida who are not part of a reservation, don't get gambling dividends, and technically are not U.S. Residents.
