Club Member **Dave Shellenbarger** has written a book "Unspoiled Will Spoil You, The History of the Development of Bonita Bay".

Dave presented a slide show summary at

a recent club meeting.
The book may be purchased from Amazon. All proceeds from the sale of the book will be held in a newly established nonprofit 501 (c) 3 corporation, Preserve Bonita Bay, Inc.

The development of Bonita Bay, an upscale retirement community in southwest Florida, followed a plan

different from other communities. Wetlands, wildlife habitats, and their supporting water flows made "off limits" before permitting and construction began.

The story of this process was gathered from newspaper archives and dozens of interviews with the people who worked in and around the community, and describes how Bonita Bay become a unique community, shared by wildlife, natural vegetation, and thousands of human residents.


All profits from the book will be held in a 501(c)3 non-profit corporation, Preserve Bonita Bay Inc. The profits will be used to provide seed funding for a memorial to David Shakarian, the founder of Bonita

Bay, or for other recreational and conservation needs in the community.

By purchasing this book, residents, stakeholders, and fans of nature preservation can register their support for the vision and ideals of **David Shakarian**, and perhaps can help to memorialize the man who envisioned and planned Bonita Bay.

appreciation for the natural beauty of Bonita Bay, its elegant lifestyle and diverse, sophisticated population has increased as the community was completed. Now that the community is fully governed by its residents, the story told in this book may increase resident understanding of how the community came to be - with the hope that residents will make decisions to preserve and nurture the community's wildlife habitats and natural areas in the future.
