The Coast Guard in SWFL

Coast Guardsmen, CPO **Keller** and PO1 **Peterson** from the CG Station at Fort Myers Beach, presented a slide show outlining the Coast Guard's organization and activities in our area.

The Coast Guard has 50,000 full time military and civilians augmented by 8,000 part time reservists and 32,000 auxiliary volunteers.

Our area is part of District 7 which covers GA, SC, and FL. We are in "Sector St Petersburg" that covers the west coast of the Florida peninsula. There are five stations in the sector with FMB being the southernmost. The Area of Responsibility of the FMB station is from Boca Grande to Rabbit Key, about 150 nm of

The mission of the Sector is "Ensuring the Safety and Security of the People, Commerce and Waters of Western Florida." The emphasis is on vessel movements through Tampa Bay.

The assets available in the Sector include an Aid to Navigation Team, 8 cutters, 24 small boats, and 321 auxiliary boats. The Air

Station Clearwater has 9 helos, 6 HC-130H fixed wing aircraft, and 2, 210' cutters.

Station Fort Myers Beach has 76 people augmented by 46 part time reservists. The station has 4 small boats in addition to the 87' cutter Marlin that is stationed here. Substations have been established at Naples and Marco to reduce the response time to events in those areas.

The CG relies heavily on other local agencies who make up the **M**arine **E**mergency **R**esponse **T**eam. Team members include local fire and county sheriff departments. "We definitely appreciate the assistance of the Auxiliary and we work with local, state and federal agencies."

Chief Keller said, "Our goal is to make sure mariners are safe on the water and it's up to us as boarding officers to go out there and ensure that the mariner is safe. We are allowed to board to make sure the vessel is in compliance with all applicable federal law and regulations. If we find contraband or illegals the boarding party become law enforcement officers."

The Chief noted that the shrimping fleet seems to have quite a lot of problems keeping up to snuff with what they are supposed to do. "The captains don't like it and they are not very happy with us but it's for their own safety. They don't like us, but when we go out and save them, then they love us."
