Home of Assistant Governor



## Paul Harris Fellowships Presented



## Wayne's Member Moment



Wayne Hemstead said that when applying he had been worried that there might have been so many "professional horsemen" already in the club that he might be ineligible. He began riding when he was eight years old. He spent his high school years working as

a groom after school and on weekends. Then, after working for 38 years, he retired and went back to his first love, horses.

When he retired he moved to Florida and earned P.A.T.H. certification as a Therapeutic Riding Instructor in Kissimmee. While there, he had a part in Shakespeare's *Taming of the Shrew*.

He moved to Naples in 2012, is an instructor at the Naples Equestrian Challenge, and teaches special needs children and adults how to ride as part of their therapy. He still feels the need to contribute and "..so what better way than to become a Rotarian."

#### Paul Tuebner USAID



Jason Dolle introduced our speaker, Paul Tuebner. He retired from USAID, a State Department agency, after 31 years service.

Paul told us he was proudest of his work in Honduras after Hurricane Mitch. He helped develop more

than 3,000 drinking water projects in small towns and cities.

USAID takes the lead for the U.S. at major disasters around the world. Paul told of his experiences in Haiti after the earthquake and in Mali where he was wounded and "didn't get a Purple Heart". He finished his career in "the basement of the Pentagon" as an advisor to the JCS.

He said in developing local projects it is important to involve local partners like Rotary Clubs. He found people's priorities are often a lot different than what the government says they are.

He is going to be talking about conservation efforts in Africa, specifically about the Rhino.




