Ken Modzelewski and the SKY Family YMCA



Richard Garner introduced the directors of the Y seated at the head table and mentioned other club members, John Spear, Jim O'Leary, Steve McIntosh, and George Cohan, who have been active at the Bonita Springs Y.

Richard then introduced Ken Modzelewski, CEO of the SKY Family YMCA, operators of the Bonita Springs YMCA. After the ill-advised closure of the Bonita Y, three years ago, SKY family Y purchased and brought new life to the Y. Ken is the "White Knight". Richard says "Ken has a big heart. He is an astute business man, but does not measure success by budgets and balance sheets. He measures his success with lives touched and families made stronger in the communities he is working in."

The SKY Family YMCA is a leading nonprofit organization committed to youth development, healthy living and social responsibility. SKY stands for "Strength & Knowledge at the YMCA."

Headquartered in Venice, Fla., the SKY Family YMCA has about 500 employees that serve at its wellness branches in Venice, Englewood, Fort Myers and Bonita Springs and public, charter middle schools, SKY Academy, in Venice and Englewood.

Each branch is guided by an advisory board of community members who are dedicated to the advancement of the Y's mission. A Metropolitan Board of Directors oversees the operations and strategic planning of the entire corporation.

The SKY Academies combine modern, 21st Century academic standards with a researchbased curriculum that focuses on total student health. The schools are free charter public middle schools open to all families regardless of home address. The SKY Academy curriculum is based on research that proves regular physical fitness conditions the mind for academic learning and also helps students build a solid emotional foundation.
