Samira is graduate of The Ohio State University and was properly greeted by #1 alumni, Roger OSŪ **Brunswick**. In addition to her professional qualifications, Samira danced and won the Star Struck Dance competition a couple of years ago.

She has been involved with health care in our community

for the last 20 years. She says the at the hospice "We care for people who more likely than not are not going to survive their serious illness. Our goal is to make them as comfortable as

possible, and really, to let them live as comfortable as possible for all the time that they have."

Samira has broadened the original Hope Hospice scope with additional care management and support programs beyond serving those with serious illness. Examples



include home based care, help for children and families coping with grief or serious illness, medical care, Parkinson resources, services for veterans, and pet services for hospice patients. The PACE program is directed at enabling participants to remain in their home rather than a nursing home. Highly personalized care is available for those facing a prognosis of months rather than years, designed to meet the

> specific needs of each individual and his or her family.

Tom said: "Specifically, I want to establish some ground rules that everyone understands and follows, each week. They are:

Go to the speaker before the meeting. Thank them for coming and let them know you appreciate them speaking to the Club. Explain that you have another commitment and, apologize for not being able to stay for their presentation.

Try to leave before they are introduced as the speaker.

Give the Sergeant-at-Arms a \$ or \$\$ for having to leave before the closing bell."
