Wendy Arsenault presented the Vocational Moment. She is one of only 300 Veterinary Cardiologists in the U.S. She has been married to Mike for 18 years and they have two sons, 11 and 9.

After getting her bachelor's degree Wendy worked as an accountant before entering the eight year program to become a DVM. She spent 4 years at NCSU, one year at U. of IL, and 3 years at Texas A&M and was certified in 2003.

She started her SWFL career as a "mobile" cardiologist, driving to other Vet's offices to treat patients.



In 2007, she opened Southwest Florida Veterinary Specialists office on Old 41 Road. In 2010, she expanded the ser-

vices to include 24/7 emergency care, and, in 2012. added Florida's only fully equipped pet



ambulance, one of six in the country.

There are now three satellite offices and 9 veterinarians on the staff providing specialist services in cardiology, internal medicine, surgery, and interventional radiology/cardiology as well as 24 hour emergency and critical care. Wendy partners with vets who offer regular care to patients who then refer to Wendy's group for specialized treatment.



Wendv says, "I am arateful to have been able to do this professionally; and the being successful in practice has brought me into this group. I love

being a part of Rotary. It's so great to be in an organization where one person's efforts combined with the group can make a huge difference."

Also, she says, "I think Rotary is a little bit of therapy...to meet with like minded individuals who have a positive, upward outlook on life..I'm thankful to you all for that "


Sara McCallum pinned a Blue Badge on **Carrie Reynolds** as we welcomed our newest club member.

LAST WEEK PROGRAM

Marjorie Rubacky introduced our speaker, Jim Dati, President of the club's Trustees of the Foundation. The Foundation was started in 1997 as a qualified 501 c(3) not-for-profit entity. Since 2006, the Board of Trustees has been separate from the club's directors.

The mission of the Foundation is to be a financial resource for community assistance and involvement with a focus on education and youth oriented programs and assistance to the needy and underprivileged. Help is often provided to local, regional, and international victims of natural disasters.

The Foundation receives money from individuals, club activities, and investment income and uses them exclusively for charitable purposes. The annual budget is in the range of \$40-50,000 a year. About 55% of the grants are for local projects, 36% for international projects, and 9% for regional projects. There is about \$200,000 in the education endowment fund with the goal of making it self-sustaining.

Before making a grant, the trustees review the operation, references, and financial information from the requesters and try to ensure that the requesters have adequate manpower and resources to be able to use the grant effectively.

Jim says, "If you have an organization or cause or you see a need and it's personal to you and you are passionate about it, bring it to the trustees attention. We are looking for opportunities."
