Carl Schwing introduced our speaker, Mayor **Ben Nelson**. Ben has been in public office for 16 years, serving two terms as



councilor and 2 terms as mayor. Carl says that since Ben didn't vote for incorporation of the city in 2000, "they made him mayor." Carl further says, "I have worked 14 different mayors in my 34 years of municipal work and Ben is the best of all of them."

Ben says, "I ran for city council because I thought this may be something I can contribute to, maybe I can become part of something bigger than myself."

He told us that it is difficult to balance business, family, and being mayor. "You're the mayor all the time. At the movie, in the grocery store, at home when the phone rings." Ben describes the biggest challenge facing the city is the attitude that, "We don't want any more people here. People move in and expect Bonita to stay just like it was when they moved in. We can't advertise that we live in paradise and then be surprised when other people say they want to come here.

"If we can allow ourselves to recognize that more people will come here, we will do the smart things that will make the process as painless as possible for the rest of us."

The Legacy of Qudrat

In February 2005, a little baby became big news in Indianapolis. The 14-month-old boy, Qudrat, was flown from Afghanistan to Indiana for life-saving surgery. His heart was not working properly. Indiana doctors fixed it.

Qudrat, who had virtually no motor skills, little strength and weighed ten pounds before surgery, gained nine pounds and became a strong little boy after the procedure.

Sadly, when Qudrat and his father Hakim Wardak, returned to their home country in April 2005, there was an unexpected and heart-wrenching turn of events. Qudrat died suddenly. The cause of death was never determined. Roberta and Jim Graham took the news hard because Qudrat and his father had lived in their Brownsburg home for three weeks before returning to Afghanistan.
