The Director of Golf



Next President Steve Slachta introduced our speaker E. J. McDonnell, Director of Golf for the Bonita Bay Club. The BB Club is one of the largest member owned clubs in the country. There are 5 golf courses, 2 facilities, 500 golf carts, with 2,500 stored golf bags. Last year 115,000 rounds of golf were played. E.J. noted that the easier way not to play any golf is to become a club pro. "We are mentors, coaches, retail managers, and accountants. Most important day to day is weatherman. Everyone wants to know what my radar looks like because it's a lot better than theirs."

E.J. got hooked on golf as a young teen, giving up football and baseball for golf. He played on the minitour circuit with modest success. With the encouragement of his fiancé, Wendy, he competes in Long Drive Tournaments and won the first one he entered.

When asked about the declining interest in golf, he says, "I don't believe golf is going downhill. PGA has a lot new initiatives going forward. Here at Bonita Bay we're trying to get former avid golfers back into the game through golf and fitness instruction. Increased participation will bring more children and grand children to the game. Our members are playing more golf than we've ever seen."

He says, "We're in the fun business. Can't take ourselves too seriously. Make sure we're having fun with it."
