Steven announced that *Installation of the 2016-2017 Officers* will be **Saturday, March 26th** at the Pelican Isle Yacht Club.

Kae Moore started his Rotary Minute by asking "Why did you join Rotary?" He says what potential members want is to be asked and to be involved in a worthy organization. He challenged all of us to make sure we ask and get people involved with us.

Sergeant-at-arms **Roger Brunswick** asked for a minute of silence in memory of former member **Jim Friedgen**.

He then introduced guests, and did little fining. The fine amounts **completely ignored** the "Fine Menu" adopted by the board and foisted on the members last fall.




Carl Schwing introduced our speaker **Matt Feeney** public works director for the city. "Matt is one of our fantastic staff members at the city. He is one of those whom we chose purposefully to work for the City of Bonita Springs because he has a unique set of skills, can get along with people, and can get things done. Also, he is part of the new generation we are trying to put into place in leadership in the city."

Matt is a graduate of Notre Dame and served as Naval Surface Warfare Officer. The topic today was "Surface Warfare, or, Transportation in the City of Bonita Springs."

The specific subject was the ideas about multiuse pathways from the recently completed visioning study for Bonita Beach Road. The focus was to see if there were any way to soften the image of the roadway not only for vehicle traffic but also for bicyclists and pedestrians.

The conclusion was there is an opportunity to to build a separated 10' cycle track and 7' pedestrian walkway. Matt explained the idea of **Multiuse Pathways** and showed an overview of the **Pedestrian Master Plan** that identified existing network and network expansion opportunities throughout the City.

He described the principal issues such as Separation from Traffic & Private Residences, Lighting and Public Safety, Landscaping, Signage, Hardscape, and Potential Projects.



There are 4 **potential projects** currently identified:

A: West Terry Street

B: Pauling or Cochran Lane

C: Imperial Interconnect

D: East Terry Street

These projects provide safe routes to schools, connectivity to recreational opportunities, and are constructible.

Matt then described the **Sun Trail: Southwest** planned to go from Tampa to Marco Island, a Florida DOT project providing a regional non-motorized trail system.


