Adam was born in Naples where his family lived since the 1950's. The family business was the "Carnival Industry" and they traveled around the country to state fairs. In the '80s much of their business was providing food and beverages at Nascar events.

> The grandfather had bought a water front property on Bonita Beach Road in the 1970's. The family thought that a boat rental business

would be a good complement to their summer carnival business. They started with 2 boats and soon had 16. They survived the 2004 hurricanes and prospered as other marinas were converted to dockuminiums.



They opened the Bay Water Exclusive Boat Club in 2006 with just one club boat and no members. Eight years later the club has grown to over 30 boats and over 300 members. "Our goal is to offer everyone the opportunity to enjoy the beautiful waterways and beaches of Southwest Florida, without the hassles of boat ownership. **Our club provides something different and unique that no other clubs can duplicate**."

"Bay Water Exclusive Boat Club is the only club in Southwest Florida that has a contractual 10:1 member to boat ratio. At Bay Water, there are 8 dock hands helping you load the boat and coolers, as well as 2 dock masters' on-site to help plan your day and go over the boat you reserved. We love the boating business, as well as the area. Our camaraderie with our members is treasured. We think of them as our friends." "We're lucky grampa bought the property. We've just invested \$3 million in the boat club. We could not have done it without the help of you guys from the Rotary Club. What I like about Rotary is the connections I make and the mentoring a lot of you gave me."


