Marjorie Rubacky, Programs

Marjorie Rubacky who does heroic work as Program Committee Chair come forward to discuss next year's programs strategy. The goal is to have programs that "inform, educate, entertain, and at times challenge."

There will be one full program about Rotary each month and one 501 (c)3 program monthly. This leaves 2 or 3 weeks for out-of-the-box programs.

Members have reported enjoying the creative programs which sometimes involve controversy. "We have learned that we have to be very careful with controversy."

Rotary International requires only that clubs not endorse candidates or take sides on public issues. However, that can be a very fine line to walk when scheduling speakers on current topics.

Marjorie thanked the monthly program chairpersons and asked that anyone contact her with opinions about any program.

Jim Dati, The Foundation

Jim explained the mission of the Foundation, "..is to act as a responsive financial resource for community involvement and assistance. Our intention is to **focus on education** and youth related programs, **assistance** to the needy and under privileged, **helping** local and international victims of natural disasters, and providing **financial assistance** for civic beautification and community relations."

The Foundation was organized as a 501 (c)3 organization in 1997 and was started with a \$5k donation. Most of the funds have been lateral transfers from the Club to the Foundation with very little direct donation. In 2006, Gerry Myers separated the Club and Foundation directors into separate boards.

The Foundation administers about \$420,000. The Club is now sending about \$40k per year to the Foundation while the Foundation is spending \$60k-75k per year.


The Foundation donations are about **60%** for local efforts (\$25 for scholarships), **30%** for international programs and grants, and **10%** for efforts like flood relief in West Virginia.
