planning for these events-domestic security, wildfires, and health events. They also help with large events so nothing bad happens. They are very good at planning and bringing folks together. Lee spoke a little about the pre Irma flooding event and Irma itself. The recovery stage is the hardest and takes the longest time. After the news crews are gone, all of our agencies are still active and 70% of the day is spent on recovery. Lee remembered when the National Hurricane Center first named Irma and how they were still busy with the flooding event. Folks came from as far away as Alaska to help. Irma could have been the worst case scenario with storm surge. We evacuate due to storm surge—you cannot weather that event. All the stops were pulled out to have the largest evacuation event in the state's history. It should be noted that shelters are not meant to be the Ritz! They're meant to keep folks alive.


