Vince introduced our speaker, Ismael Hernandez, Founder and President of the Freedom and Virtue Institute. The son of a Marxist, a member of the



Puerto Rican Communist Party, Ismael was taught that America was the enemy of the human race and needed to be destroyed. He remembered, from an early age, his mother crying because his father couldn't keep a job to feed their four children. He also remembered never ending communist

meetings and 7 hours speeches by Fidel. Ismael wanted that kind of commitment. His mother would sneak the children to mass so in order to mix Marxism and Jesus, he joined the Jesuits. He wanted to go to Sandinista Nicaragua and study the liberation theology that was brewing at the University of El Salvador. Just after 7 Jesuits were murdered in the 80s in the home he was going to be living in, he left seminary, came to the US, and landed in Dixie! Shortly after that Ismael's lungs were filled with the breath of freedom and he began to experience things that were in conflict with his prior beliefs. In American he learned about the uniqueness of the



individual and the connection between reward and accomplishment, which was the basis for the Freedom and Virtue Institute. The Institute promotes individual liberty, selfreliance, and human dignity by fostering attitudes and leading initiatives that create self-reliance among the underprivileged.

Somewhere over the rainbow, blue birds fly. Birds fly over the rainbow, why, then oh why, can't I?




