Last Week's Program



Bob Matheson, Immediate Past President of the Financial Planning Association of Southwest Florida made a presentation titled "Is a Financial Storm Approaching?" Bob presented some alarming statistics such as the National debt reaching an unprecedented level of nearly \$8 Trillion and it is

growing at greater than \$2 billion per day. The average American family has \$18,700 in debt not including the mortgage on their home. We are faced with the refinancing of 50% of our government debt in the next few years. Currently our top lenders, Japan owns \$684 Billion of our debt, China \$284 Billion and the UK \$174 Billion. Down the list is Korea, which has reduced its level to \$50 Billion and is refusing to purchase any more or our debt. Bob suggests that we take precautions and invest more conservatively. He says that CDs even at 6% are not the answer, since the interest is taxed and with 3.8% inflation we may net 0%. Bonds are not the answer. With the threat of a hike in interest rates the value of bonds we hold will decrease. There are investments available that protect consumers against a downturn in our economy. Bob recommends reassessing our strategies and to look at products of that type as well as looking at working with advisors, who can help with timing our buying and selling of investments. He recommends, too, to protect ourselves by purchasing higher levels of liability insurance and to increase our umbrella liability coverage to at least \$2 million. His handouts advocate the use of trusts and he recommends considering long-term care insurance. He points out that we know that as Florida residents we protect against hurricanes. We must protect against a likely financial storm, too.

Last Week's Program

Sue Masters introduced Dr. Peter Bergerson, PhD, Professor of the Division of Public Affairs, who has expertise in political science. Dr. Bergerson talked about the 2008 U. S. Presidential election. We learned that this is the first election since the 1952 election when Dwight D. Eisenhower was elected president that we will witness an open election. There is no heir apparent, such as a vice-president. As a



result the field is wide open. The difficult decision for delegates, the media and the electorate is sorting out the contenders from the pretenders. To get the nomination of one's party it is estimated that a candidate will have to spend \$100 million through the process. Candidates must contend with not only their opponents but also party rules and must choose to receive or not federal

funds, which come with restrictions. At the moment the average voter is not tuned into what is happening. Party activists are busy raising funds and establishing committees. The pros know that on election day in 2008 20 states will determine the election, because of the large blocks of electoral votes they control. In the summer of 2008 the Republicans will be meeting in Minneapolis and after that the Democrats will meet in Denver. Dr. Bergerson predicts that the candidates will have been chosen prior to those conventions. Voting is emotional. Voters will vote for the candidate who is credible and capable and the less partisan the better for the candidate's chances. Super Tuesday, February 5, 2008 will find the pretenders back on the sidelines at the end of the day. Many candidates although not admitting it are running for the Number 2 spot on the ticket. On the Democrat side Clinton, Obama and Edwards and on the Republican side McCain, Guiliani, Romney, Gingrich and Pataki and possibly Jeb Bush are the contenders at the moment for the top job. Stay tuned.





Steve McIntosh introduced **George Clover**, Principal, Estero High School. Mr. Clover started his talk by complimenting and thanking Bonita Springs Rotary for

its involvement with the school. He has been with Lee County Schools since 1985. There has been a steady decline in the number of students at the high school since 2004 when he became principal. In 2004 there were 2150 students. Now there are 1600, which is attributed to the opening of South Ft. Myers High School, but more of a factor is the change in demograph-



ics of Estero. Young families can no longer afford to live in the area. The high housing costs effects teachers as well. They need to live outside of the area and drive great distances to work. Mr. Clover told us of the many positive things happening at EHS. He told of a young member of student government, Ian Waterhouse, who happens to be the president of the Florida State Student Government Association. Ian is leading an effort to raise \$30,000 to send 30 children's oncology patients and their families to Disney World. EHS has honors programs. Advanced placement is available to students along with dual programs, which enable the students to take their high school courses along with courses at Edison College or Florida Gulf Coast University. EHS has the second highest SAT scores in the county. It has the fewest students in the Alternative Learning Center in the county. The ALC serves students, who cannot complete the typical course work at the high school. Mr. Clover declared that he realizes there are gang members at EHS, but they don't have a gang problem. Students are required to declare a major each year. This has helped lower the dropout rate. There are 30 students in the Medical Academy preparing for work in medical clinics and nursing homes. Many students are preparing for careers in the hospitality industry. There are many opportunities for students to participate in extracurricular activities such as in band or sports. Mr. Clover offered an invitation to us to come to activities at the school. He told us of one of their baseball players who is sought after by major league teams and is certain to sign a multi-million dollar contract. Many of their teams have gone to state meets recently. He told us that EHS will meet the 25 to 1 student ratio soon and that all-in-all things are going well at EHS.

Bridewell's Host Super Bowl XLI Party



Don Johnson, a bridge builder from Manitoba



Don Johnson is a long time seasonal visitor from Thompson, Manitoba. Thompson is 500 miles north of Winnipeg. It was sunny in Thompson on Valentine's Day, but the temperature was minus 20 F.

After Don graduated from high school in Vancouver, BC, he joined the family jewellry business as an apprentice. In 1947, he moved to Winnipeg, Manitoba. There he finished his apprenticeship, became a Master Watchmaker and Graduate Jeweller of The Canadian Jewellers Institute, and opened a jewellry store.

In the early 60's, the International Nickel Company (Inco) found and developed the largest fully integrated nickel mining complex in the free world, 500 miles north of Winnipeg. This included building the totally modern city of Thompson with Canada's first enclosed shopping mall. The city was built to accommodate 20,000 people with a market area population of about 75,000.

Don and his wife, Louise, decided to move to Thompson where they might be the big fish in the small pond rather the small fish in the Winnipeg pond. They never looked back. In addition to the jewellry business, they were involved in a high rise apartment building, a night club, and a florist business. When they went to Thompson, the highway from Winnipeg ended about 300 miles to the south. Don, as president of the Chamber of Commerce, organized a cavalcade to drive through the forest on logging roads and limestone eskers to Winnipeg to appeal for extending the highway to Thompson. As a result, a gravel road was completed in 1967, and an all weather highway was finished in 1968.

Don has been a member of The Rotary Club of Thompson, Manitoba since 1966. He served as president and was awarded a Paul Harris Fellowship in 1976. In 1995, he was the project manager for the construction of the "Rotary Bridge over the Grass River". This suspension bridge took two summers to complete and provides hiking access to the Manitoba's highest water fall.

Louise and Don have been married 55 years. They now live on the shore of a pristine lake about 10 miles south of Thompson.

Don says" We live in the best of two worlds, Northern Canada for eight months, and Naples, Florida for four months. Truly 'The Canadian Dream'...eh".

Engineers have recognized for many years the need for business acumen and FGCU has

moved the Engineering Department into the College of Business. Scientists at FGCU are studying to improve the water quality of Lake Okeechobee and are working to solve the red tide problem in the Gulf. So far \$250 million has been raised in Southwest Florida for the benefit of the university. We learned that the investment has been worth it and are fortunate to have this educational resource in our midst.





the group. We learned early in the presentation about projects in the area that they have completed or are in the process of completing including Galleria at the Forum and Orion Center in Fort Myers; Plaza del Sol, Coconut Crossing and Corkscrew Palms in Estero; and Vanderbilt Galleria, Sao Grato and Andalucia in Naples. Though there are many obstacles in their path the team has a plan to accomplish completion. Included in the new community, which is being built in their "Smart Village" spirit will be 530 residences. There will be homes affordable to people working in the area such as teachers, police and fire fighters. There will be 300,000 square feet of commercial space including retail, restaurants and a boutique hotel, general and medical office space and the new 36,000 square foot Gulfshore Playhouse, which the group has donated. Estero on the River will be a complete town with access to other areas by Lee Tran, but many people will live, play and shop within walking distance in a town with sidewalks on both sides of tree lined streets. Main Street will be on the shore of a lake and the Estero River is at the heart of the community. The environment will be upgraded through the removal of exotic plants and a buffer will be created on both sides of the river.

Estero on the River is the culmination of a vision of the D'Jamoos family and their company.

Kevin Lewis of Southwest Florida Addiction Services (SWFAS) was our speaker. SWFAS has been rebuilding lives and families since 1980. The group prides itself in being Southwest Florida's leader in sub-

stance abuse treatment and is the oldest and largest treatment provider in Southwest Florida. More than 63,000 residents from Lee, Collier, Charlotte, Glades and Hendry counties have turned to SWFAS for help with addiction.

At present, SWFAS has 25 detox beds and about 60 patients on the waiting list. The organization is in the process of constructing an \$8 million, 40 bed, detox facility next to the Southwest Florida Regional Medical Center. It will be able to help about 1,700 more people per year. The Lee County Commissioners recently approved \$2 million to help build the facility.

Last Week: Al Oerter



Jason Dolle introduced Al Oerter, 4 time Olympic Gold Medalist and internationally known artist who entertained us with anecdotes from his athletic career and described his new venture, The Olympic Art Museum, in Fort Myers.

Al's Olympic record is unsurpassed. He was the Olympic Gold Medalist <u>and</u> Olympic record holder in four consecutive games, 1956, 1960, 1964, and 1968. At the 1960 Rome Olympics, Al did poorly in his first four attempts. His teammate Rink Babka, who was leading the event, gave him helpful advice before his fifth throw and Al threw the discus for a new Olympic record. Babka was not able to beat Al's throw and finished with the silver medal.

Al retired from athletics after the 1968 Olympics. He did make an attempt to qualify for the American team in 1980, but finished fourth. Nonetheless he made his overall best throw that year at the age of 43.

Al found fourteen Olympian artists from seven countries who were exhibiting their art work. These are people who aspire to excellence in art as well as sport. They have 24 medals, 28 world records and 33 national championships in their sports. They are now converting a building on the waterfront in Fort Myers. The city will contribute some funds, but the group needs a "few million" to build the museum properly.

RR Ralph Atkinson Retiring From Rotary

club in Sylvania, Ohio, a
suburb of Toledo. He will



continue his affiliation with Rotary, however, as a member of the "Rotary Retreads" organized two years ago at Bentley Village by our Honorary Member, **Joe Norton.**

Ralph, who has attended this club for several months a year since 2000, continues

in good health. He has decided, however, to begin "taking it a little easier". Nevertheless, he and Alice, his bride of almost 66 years, continue to "work out" for about an hour every day exercising at the Bentley Wellness Center.

Growing up as a farm boy in north central Michigan, Ralph earned his chemical engineering degree from the University of Michigan and joined the Standard Oil Company of Ohio in 1939. His career was interrupted by five years in the US Army. As the Ordnance General Supply Officer for the First Army, Lt. Col. Atkinson had responsibility for assembling the weapons and equipment for the D-Day Invasion and for the first 30 days of combat by all forces in Europe.

Afterward he returned to SOHIO and spearheaded its post-war expansion program, which included a major enlargement of the refinery at Lima, Ohio, to become the largest facility of its kind between Chicago and the East Coast. Later, he was named to be its manager. It was there he was inducted as a member of the Rotary Club of Lima in 1970. After retirement, he moved to Sylvania, and has been a member of that club since 1986.

Ralph and Alice were married June 14, 1941 and have three children, five grandchildren and five great grandchildren.

Always a gentleman and a leader by example, Ralph, in his own quiet way, has won the respect and admiration of friends and associates throughout his long and productive career. His regular presence in our meetings will be greatly missed.



Major General Bernard L. Weiss, (USAF Retired) was introduced by Kenny King. General Weiss has expertise in the area of logistics and he delivered a very enlightening presentation regarding the state of our military. He told us how our

military should be capable of being involved in wars in two theaters of operations, but currently they are being stretched by our involvement in Iraq. Our military is a 100% volunteer force. Instituting the Draft would never happen. Our politicians are into preserving their offices. The Draft would be extremely unpopular with the voters. There has been suggestions that the standards be lowered, so that volunteers with less than a high school education or a GED could qualify. Lowering standards brings a whole new set of problems with which the military must deal. Currently there are 135,000 men and women on the ground in Iraq and the Surge will bring that to 150,000. There are about an equal number of contract employees working in Irag training the Iragis and providing security. General Weiss pointed out the disparity in pay. An enlisted person receives about \$900/month. If he/she is married his/her family qualifies for food stamps. Contract employees can earn \$150,000/year and have \$250,000 of life insurance compared to \$100,000 for the enlistee. He was not at all concerned about being PC in stating his suggestions on dealing with Islamic extremists.



Kris Cella of Cella Molnar & Associates a transportation consulting firm presented a 3 hour program in 20 minutes on the tolling of I-75. Her presentation illustrated that change is inevitable and in the case of I-75 it is important that planning and implementation of the



plan to expand to 10 lanes be carried out as soon as it is possible. We were told that the expansion to six lanes in 2010 will not ease congestion. Conventional funding from the state and federal governments for ten lanes will not be available until 2030. Population growth and the use of I-75 by the increased numbers of Southwest Floridians will outstrip the capability of a 6 lane road by the time it is completed. We learned that only 15% of users are passing through the area. The remaining 85% are people living and working in the area. The plan, which originated with Lee and Collier Counties, is being implemented by the Southwest Florida Expressway Authority. The plan is to expand to 10 lanes of which 6 will be tolled. Transponders, not toll booths will be used. Ms. Cella is making presentations throughout the area in order to get feedback regarding the plan from residents of the area. Dr. James Croley, MD of the Cataract and Refractive institute of Florida presented a program on the VIP (Visually Impaired Person) Center. Dr. Croley made a video presentation which showed how the center trains people to be self sufficient. He pointed out

that the board of directors of the VIP Center is primarily made up of visually impaired people and asked if any of Bonita Springs Rotary members would like to help by serving on the board or by helping in some way. He shared with us that the First Annual Eye Ball-Charity for the Blind in Southwest Florida in April drew 90 attendees and raised \$30,000. He would like to see this event grow in order raise the funds needed to help the visually impaired of South Lee County, Bonita Springs and Collier County. We learned that the VIP Center did have a facility in Naples, but rising rents forced the center to close, so Dr. Croley has offered some space in his office to help serve the needs of people in this area. Blindness is increasing dramatically in the US due to ever aging Baby Boom generation, the increased incidences of diabetes, macular degeneration and glaucoma. Dr. Croley recommends an eye exam at least every two years. He pointed out that a person would not know they were developing glaucoma unless they were examined. Roger Brunswick, Rotary Program Host for July, introduced Michael Mastej, CEO of Physicians Regional Medical Center - Collier Boulevard. He gave us insight into the inner workings of his facility, which is one of the many operated by HMA, which is

headquartered in Naples. He pointed out that HMA operates hospitals and medical centers in many states and as far away as Yakima, Washington, but mainly in the southeastern states. Mr. Mastej's talk focused mainly on the operation of the new facility, a 100 bed hospital, which he manages. The hospital was five years in the making and opened on February 5, 2007. He likened the opening day patients to people waiting for a garage sale to start in that they were waiting for the doors to open and the hospital has been busy ever since that day. The utilization of the Collier Boulevard hospital is evidence that one was needed in East Naples. Obstetrics and Pediatric Care is delivered at that facility, unlike the Pine Ridge facility. Seventy-five babies have been born there in the first 5 months of operation. The hospital is noted for providing vascular surgery and has attracted patients from as far north as Estero. The hospital will eventually expand to over 400 beds and an 80,000 square foot medical clinic managed by HMA will be opened soon near the hospital. To learn more go to

Shots for Tots Total Passes 11,000

The Rotary Club of Bonita Springs has reported that 470 immunizations were administered to 166 area children during in the Bonita Shots for Tots program during the first half of 2007.

This brings the total since the program was begun in January 1995, to 11,233 immunizations for 5.368 children.

Shots for Tots is a joint effort of the Rotary Club, the First Presbyterian Church of Bonita Springs, and the Lee County Health Department. Immunizations against the various childhood diseases are offered without charge to all children under the age of 18 from 5 to 8 PM on the first Tuesday of every month. The next clinic will be held at the Church on Tuesday evening, July 3.

The immunizations are administered by Registered Nurses on the staff of the Health Department. Rotary volunteers assist with the coordination and administration of the clinics. In the 12 and one-half years since this project was begun, more than 50 Rotarians and their spouses have participated, many of them several times every year.

The Rotary Club sponsorship of the Shots for Tots project was undertaken at the request of the Lee County Children's Services Council, because there was no other opportunity in the southern part of the county for children to receive these much needed immunizations to safeguard their health.

Stephanie Kissinger introduced Phil Kinsey, Chief of Bonita Springs Fire Control & Rescue District. He gave a very informative presentation about his department, its staff and the services it provides. We learned that the department responded to 5500 emergencies last year. Medical emergencies accounted for 85% of those calls. Chief Kinsey

then demonstrated very graphically by asking us to hold our breath. Response times currently are at 6 minutes for most emergencies in Bonita Springs. A reduction in personnel and services due to budget cuts, the result of tax reform, could result in response times of up to 12 minutes. More fatalities will occur when people have heart attacks or critical accidental injuries. Chief Kinsey feels that his presentation is not a "scare tactic" rather an important explanation to residents of what their votes on tax cuts can mean and that his facts enable voters to make an informed decision. His department has an excellent website. www.bonitafire.org. Go there and learn about the many services such as CPR classes available to Bonita Springs residents. Thanks, Chief!

Last Week's Program

Stephanie Kissinger introduced Jack Wert, Executive Director, Naples, Marco Island and Everglades Convention and Visitors Bureau, Paradise Coast. He promotes the area known as Florida's Last Paradise. We learned that the 1.4 million visitors to Collier County in 2006 spent \$744 mil-



lion and had a \$1.1 billion impact on our economy. Tourists paid sales and gas taxes totaling \$74 million, which reduced the taxes on each Collier County household by \$547. Wert debunked many of the myths of tourism. Tourists do not cause road congestion. Seasonal residents cause congestion demonstrated by traffic patterns after Easter. He was quick to point out that seasonal residents are crucial to the economy of the area. too. More tourists all year round is his goal in order to lessen the effects of fluctuations in visitors on the work force. His office cooperates with other tourism promoters, especially Lee County. He told us of the effort to draw more people through the use of websites. One is www.floridasgolfcoast.com aimed at golfers. The website of his bureau is

www.paradisecoast.com. Tourism is definitely an effort by many organizations, the Hotel & Lodging Association, Visit Florida, Economic Development Commission, SW Florida International and the Naples Airport and FGCU with its Resort & Hospitality Program. Most important we learned that we don't have a hurricane season, we have a windy season. Thanks, Jack! Wert!

Last Week's Program

Jose Lopez, Program Host for August, introduced Bonita Springs Assistance Office President, Mark McCaw and Administrator, Lois Hollands, who made a presentation, "A Community Initia-



tive to Create The Bonita Springs Family Resource Center." Mark and Lois told us of the need for such a center in that 7 of 10 elementary school students are on the free/reduced price lunch program, 21% of current Bonita Springs residents ages 21 through 64 have disabilities and in 2004 it was determined that 25% of the population did not have health insurance. The plan is to build two buildings on a 17.11 acre parcel at W. Terry and Matheson Streets. The Bonita Springs Assistance Office Building I would have 27,260 square feet and would provide office space for many 501(c) (3) organizations serving those in need. The Salvation Army building would be 20,000 square feet. Mark pointed out who would be served and pointed out who would not. too. This would not be a soup kitchen or an overnight homeless shelter for transients. Some of the organizations located there would be the United Way of Lee County, Bonita Partnership for Compassion, Bonita Springs Area Housing Development Corporation, Deaf Service of Southwest Florida, Department of Human Services, LARC (Lee County Association of Retarded Citizens), Lee Memorial Health Systems, Southwest Workforce Development Board, SWFAS (Southwest Florida Addiction Services), and many more. Visit their excellent website at www.bsfrc.org. Thanks, Mark and Lois.

Kathy Fredrickson, wife of our immediate past president, **Dick Fredrickson**, had successful surgery in Cincinnati last Tuesday to repair a crushed vertebra suffered in a recent fall at their cottage in Canda.

Rather than placing her in the traditional body cast, doctors used a new procedure in which they inserted a balloon into the vertebra through a tiny tube, pressurized the balloon to expand the vertebra to its original size, then forced a special cement into the cavity to hold it in place. They will remain at her daughter's in Cincinnati for post-operative rehabilitation.

Superintendent Is Speaker

Dr. James Browder, Superintendent of the Lee County School System, reviewed some of the challenges our schools face at the meeting last week. Introduced by Program



Chair, **Jose Lopez**, Dr, Browder said that many of the problems relate to the rapid growth and the movement of families within the district.

He said that in addition to the net growth of about 3,000 students when schools open this month, another 9,000 students will be in different schools because their families have relocated from one part of the county to another. When he came here 35 years ago enrollment was about 16,000. Now it is about 82,000. Five new schools will be built this year and at least four more next year.

The "class size" amendment, he warned will have serious consequences. Not only may it bankrupt the state with the cost of erecting new school buildings, but is already causing a "huge" shortage of qualified school teachers. This past year, Lee County was unable to fill 50 teaching positions. It will get worse, he said, because colleges are not turning out teachers in sufficient numbers to fill the need.

Dr. Browder expressed his pride in the district's teachers and what they are accomplishing. Good teachers have a powerful influence on the lives of children that lasts forever. "Thank a teacher for what he or she is doing for our community," he said.

Our Schools Are A Big Business

With more than 11,000 employees, the Lee County School System is the largest employer south of St. Petersburg. Annual budget for operations and new school construction is \$1.7 million.

There are 101 schools serving 82,000 students, making the system among the top 50 in the United States. Ninth in Florida.

Because one-half of the students are from families below the poverty level, the system serves 10 million meals a year — 2.8 million breakfasts and 7.2 million lunches.

The system has 700 buses traveling about 75,000 miles a day transporting 46,000 students to and from school. Buses are now fitted with a GPS device which allows the district to track location, speed, time at each stop, etc., of each bus.

Students represent 159 countries and speak 98 different languages. More than 8,000 are "limited English proficient."

More than 10,000 volunteers regularly contribute hundreds of thousands of hours of service in our schools. In addition to value of their personal attention and care, this translates to a \$15 million contribution.

Proud To Be Paul Harris Fellow

Dr. Browder expressed again his appreciation for the recognition our Rotary Club gave to him fifteen years ago when it contributed \$1,000 to the Rotary International Foundation in his name to designate him as a **Paul Harris Fellow.**

At the time he was serving as the first principal of Estero High School, and the award was given in recognition of his many contributions to our community. He said that as he has moved through various assignments in the meantime, he has always been proud of that award.

Dr. Marci Greene, Ed. D., Professor and Dean of the College of Education at Florida Gulf Coast University was introduced by Jose Lopez, Program Host for the Month of August. Dr. Greene recounted the growth and maturity of the university, since it was founded

in 1997. The campus is now made up of over 60 buildings and is still growing. She praised the various civic organizations such as Rotary that have supported the university in its endeavors. She told of interesting programs such as the First Generation Grants, which are given to students, who are the first of their families to ever attend college. The university has established a graduate program. Hodges ranks in the top 10 universities in the US in serving the Hispanic community, 25% of the students are Hispanic. The schools at Hodges are the School of Allied Health, the Kenneth Oscar Johnson School of Business, the School of Professional Studies and the School of Technology. 

Last Week's Program

Nancy Wyckoff, our Program Host for September introduced Nancy Keefer, Bonita Springs Noon Rotarian and no stranger to our club and known personally by many, which was obvious by the numbers of her friends greeting her with hugs. She speaks to our club every year in an effort



to bring us up to date on what is happening in the Bonita Springs area. We learned that despite the slow down in the economy nationally the economy locally is still healthy although not as booming as in the near past. We learned that the chamber office has 40,000 visitors in a year. The Bonita Springs Chamber of Commerce is certified as one of the few accredited chambers of commerce in the US. One of the goals for the near future is to increase the percentage of voter turnout. Currently it is at a dismal 17%. Nancy says that the median age is dropping and now is at age 50 in Bonita Springs. The Bonita Springs Chamber of Commerce membership is down from a high of 1300 members to 1200 and a third of those dropping out had gone out of business. A sign of the economic times. Unemployment in the area is at 2.6%, which is about half of the national average. One of the problems facing employers is the lack of available workers. And, one of the reasons is that old bugaboo that we have heard talked about by many of our speakers, "affordable housing." Workers will not come here if they cannot afford to live near work. The bad news. Residential building permits through August are at 77. Last year they were at 376. (See next page)

According to Nancy there is good news. During the same time period, Commercial permits were up to 46 compared to 24 last year. This is a sign that businesspeople have faith that the economy will turn around. One thing that is of great concern to the Chamber of Commerce and its members is the Hometown Democracy Referendum movement, which if passed could cause chaos within the business community. Instead of trusting the local elected officials to make the right decisions, many issues would have to go to referendum and there would be a large percentage of voters, who would vote to block any change in the community. Hometown Democracy has a nice sound to it, but is it best for everyone? The Bonita Chamber of Commerce will be involved in educating voters. Thanks, Nancy Wyckoff for introducing **Nancy Keefer**. We hope to hear your report next year and that you will bring us news that our business climate has had an upswing. For more information go to:

Diane Lepola is a Rotarian who practices "Service Above Self." She is an example for all of us. Thanks. Diane!


Clean Water Project

Nancy Wyckoff, Program Host for September. Richard is a
native of the Bronx,
that's Bronx, N.Y.,
where else. There is a
lot of interest in what
the U.S. Postal Service does, which was
indicated by the number of questions

asked at the end of the presentation. Richard started with the Post Office by working on the dock and he worked his way up the ladder. He has lived in Bonita Springs for 35 years. He takes pride in operating a very efficient organization that operated 2% under budget last year. He leads 90 workers providing service to 33,611 stops daily. Last year his team delivered 97 million pieces of mail. Richard says that seasonal patrons account for 60% of the mail business in peak of season. In addition to the main office on Old 41 and the branch on Bonita Beach Road there are numerous contract providers throughout the community and her urges us to patronize them.

poor public relations of Juan Ponce de Leon, who met his demise in this area when the Calusa tribe paid him back for previous offenses with an arrow, which caused Juan's death in 1521. The Calusa's capital was at Mound Key in Estero Bay. We learned that Bonita Springs got the name when a group incorporated and changed the name from Survey and changed Surveyor's Creek to the Imperial River. The society will be publishing a booklet highlighting the historic properties and community identity, thanks to a \$13,000 grant received from the City's Partnering For Results program and the Lee County Arts and Attractions Fund. We learned a great deal about what we have been missing, such as the Robert Storter Folk Art collection, which was at the Liles Hotel and is now in Miami at the South Florida Museum. There is a plethora of history waiting to be learned by the current residents of this area. Did you know that you can become a member of the Bonita Springs Historical Society and receive a newsletter for a mere \$20? Charlie stated it well, "It is said that a well educated public is the best protection for our cultural heritage." Go to the society's website to learn more.



Gifts of Independence

An inspiring presentation of how Rotarians can make a huge difference in the lives of people in third world countries was given last week by **Don Manley.**

Drawing upon his perexperisonal ence as member of the Findlay, Ohio Rotary Club, which purchased a full container Ωf 280 wheelchairs and delivered them to



help disabled people in San Salvador, he told and showed how lives were changed.

Rotary Clubs and Rotarians around the world are working with the Wheelchair Foundation to provide a free wheelchair to every child, teen and adult world-



wide who needs one, but has no means to acquire one. Independence is being given to people deprived of mobility by war, disease, accident, natural disaster and advanced age.

It is estimated that as many as 100 million people worldwide need wheel chairs, though less than one percent have access to one.



The wheelchairs are rugged, designed for use in developing countries. Purchased in bulk from manufactures in China, they cost \$150, half of which is covered by the Wheelchair Foundation. Thus, a gift of \$75 can provide a chair.

Don showed photos of the large group of Findlay Rotarians delivering chairs, and helping disabled children and adults into them. Many had been living without any mobility assistance. Thus, the gift changed many lives completely.

He showed a 41-year-old man, crippled by polio as a child, who had never walked, mobile for the first time with the gift of a chair. He showed a group of police officers, all of whom had been disabled, now able to work effectively, thanks to their new wheelchairs.

The Wheelchair Foundation and Rotary have delivered 140,000 chairs in 120 countries and regions.

Don who has worked in Central America with water projects and Habitat for Humanity, told us that international service projects had given him, "the best days of my life, outside my family."

Vaccines now offered include: tetanus, diphtheria, polio, hepatitis A, hepatitis B, measles, mumps, rubella, chicken pox, meningitis, haemophilus type B, human papilloma virus, pneumococcal infections, rotavirus and influenza.

The October 2 clinic, staffed by **Ira** and **Clarice Hawk**, served 42 families.

Rotarian Jim Horein introduced Dr. James A. Kutsch, PhD who told us his story and that of The Seeing Eye. Dr. Kutsch is shown here with his partner, Dolby, a Golden Retriever. Dr. Kutsch was blinded at age 16 by a chemical explosion. Despite this setback in life he went on to earn his PhD in

computer science from the University of Illinois by developing the first talking computer terminal. He is the President of The Seeing Eye, which came into existence in 1929 and is the oldest of the 11 accredited schools of this type in North America. The Seeing Eyes students come from all 50 states and all of the provinces of Canada. Dr. Kutsch said the key word for people in the U.S. whether sighted or not is "independence." It is the core philosophy built into each of us. The mission of Seeing Eye is to breed, raise and train Seeing Eye dogs and to train their partners and to keep in contact with both dogs and the students for life. Many of their graduates have had many dogs. Dr. Kutsch told us that Dolby is his 6th dog. His first joined him in 1970. Seeing Eye has bred and trained more than 14,000 dogs for over 8,000 people. No funds come to the school from government or insurance. The school gets all of its money from private sources such as service clubs like Bonita Springs Rotary. We learned that there are 4 different breeds used as dog guides, German Shepherds, Black Labs, Golden Retrievers and a mixed breed of Lab and Golden Retriever. 

Last Week's Program



Program Host, Marjorie
Rubacky, introduced Marian
Mosser, Ph.D., Criminal Justice Professor, Hodges University. Dr. Mosser is a retired U. S. Army Lt. Col. with expertise in counterterrorism. Her accomplishments during her 25 years of experience in the field include serving as the U. S. Army's senior antiterrorism officer managing the Antiterrorism Cell in the

Intelligence and Operations Center in the Pentagon where she managed the antiterrorism policies and procedures for the U.S. Army worldwide. She managed activities that resulted in capturing a spy and provided critical intelligence that resulted in the capture of 5 terrorists. We learned that terrorism is premeditated motivated violence against noncombatant targets in our free society. Dr. Mosser told us that some terrorists have been trained from age 5 to prepare them to carry out suicide attacks. Why would someone become a suicide bomber, which is outside the teaching of the Koran? They are taught that a suicide attack is a ticket to heaven for them and their friends and relatives and they are assured of the company of 72 virgins upon their arrival there. They are heroes. They come from all walks of life. Some have doctorate degrees. Their acts are not irrational, they are not crazy. They are martyrs for their cause, which is Islamic Fundamentalism. Antiterrorisms is difficult work in that a suicide bomber is not planning to escape or evade capture. Terrorists are mobile and pick targets of opportunity and work to get the greatest effect of their act, an alternate bus more crowded than the first. Thanks, Dr. Mosser, for your insight!

Martha Erickson, Program Host for December, introduced Naples Rotarian and Past District 6960 Governor 2002-03, Hal Antzigen, who is the Polio Plus Partners Coordinator in Rotary Zone 34. In her introduction, Martha quoted her husband, G. Walter Erickson, MD, from a lecture that he

made to interns in 2000 regarding the discovery of the polio vaccine. We learned among many interesting bits of information from Hal that the Rotary International Foundation has been offered \$100 million by the Gates Foundation provided we can match it in Rotary years 2008-11. The money is to be used in the Polio Plus effort. In 1985 Rotary International pledged to eradicate polio by 2005, the 100th anniversary of Rotary. We fell short, but we are well on the way to our goal of ridding the world of this dread disease. Rotary is not alone in this endeavor. We are working with UNICEF, WHO and the CDCs. In 1985 there were 350,000 new cases of polio in the world. In 2007 there have been only 763 new cases, down 1,000 cases from 2006. By the end of 2008 all of India will be immunized, which leaves only 3 countries, Nigeria, Pakistan and Afghanistan where work is yet to be done. Since 1985, Rotary International has contributed \$650 million to the effort to wipe out polio, second only to the United States government. Rotary leadership, internationally, at the district level and locally are gearing up to make sure we meet the Gates Foundation challenge to raise \$100 million to match their \$100 million. This is another reason to recruit new members. Thanks. Hal.

Last Week's Program

Program Host for December, Martha Erickson, introduced Bonita Springs Rotarian, Sandy Scoggins, Water Project Chairperson who gave a very thorough explanation of what the project is about and how we can be part of her "Million Person Challenge." Sandy came to Florida primed to join Rotary and to get involved in making a differ-



ence in the world. She had joined the Naperville Rotary Club in Illinois and just after completing orientation, but before being inducted, she and her husband Keith moved to Florida. Keith and my wife, Barbara Pagel, had both worked in the Farm Credit Services System. Rotary came up over dinner at our place and the rest is history. Lucky, lucky us. The lesson: Recruit new energetic members, who want to be a Rotarian. Fred Partin got a willing volunteer to head an international project. It is obvious that Sandy knows how to get things done. This first effort totaling \$50,000 will provide clean water to 11,000 people. If \$50,000 helps that number of people, \$500,000 will complete a "Million Person Challenge." Sandy explained how this first effort will work, down to showing us the filters that are part of the filtration systems. One of the key ingredients of the program is financing. Every \$1 donated here in Bonita Springs and at other locations becomes \$4 through matches by districts and Rotary International. Sandy and her committee of Linda Ritzert, Roger Brunswick, Paul Van Valkenburg and Bob Pagel decided that Sandy's idea of working with experienced Rotarians was the way to get this project (next page)

done. Sandy discovered George Lewis through a search on the internet. George has conducted similar successful projects with his club in Florence Oregon in Rotary District 5110. He had personal contact with the first lady of Guatemala and Rotarian Juan Carlos Cheves of the Guatemala Sur club in District 4250. The first lady, Mrs. Berger, selected the filtration system. The containers are manufactured in Guatemala and the Q Beta filters come from England. How can Bonita Springs Rotarians contribute? First, buy a package of the note cards that are available for \$25. If we buy a total of 40 boxes, George Lewis, who's artwork is on the card, will donate all of the proceeds to the Guatemala Water Project. Second, you can donate to the Bonita Springs Rotary Foundation and earmark the money for our Water Project. Sandy mentioned an opportunity for those of us age 70.5 or older. In tax year 2007 we can donate all or part of our Required Minimum Distribution directly from the companies holding our funds and avoid paying taxes on that money. It is a better way to contribute, since you haven't received it and paid taxes only taking a deduction for a contribution. This must be done by December 31, since this tax law only applies to the 2007 Tax Year. Sandy told us that 6000 children die each day the result of drinking contaminated water. No children die in the United States the result of drinking contaminated water. Providing clean water to developing countries is a major goal of Rotary International. Sandy is offering to lead our club in an effort to make a difference in the world. She is going to Guatemala to learn more in February and will be meeting with the first lady. Let's follow Sandy.
