Marianne W. Rodgers, Director of the School of Nursing at Florida Gulf Coast University (pictured below) offered an overview of the nursing profession both in Florida and on a national basis.

Director Rodgers offered insight into the Florida Nursing Workforce Shortage, suggesting that if most nurses retire by age 60, Florida can expect to lose more than 40% of its currently licensed



RN populations over the next decade.

Strategies are being developed to curb said nursing decline. They include improving the image of nursing, creating a work environment supportive of the practice of nursing,

and recruiting qualified applicants who represent the diverse population of Florida.

Director Rodgers also discussed attempts being made to recruit men into the nursing profession. These efforts have resulted in the number of men in nursing rising from 5% to 9% with men accounting for approximately 13% of students enrolled in nursing education programs.

The presentation concluded with remarks about Retention and Graduate Residencies and the University Health System Consortium.

A lively question and answer session followed. Thanks Director Rodgers for an excellent and thought-provoking presentation.



Last Week's Program—Healthcare's "Perfect Storm"

Jim Nathan, President of the Lee Memorial Health System (pictured alongside Program Host Mark Petrites) offered an engaging presentation "Healthcare, Southwest Florida and the Perfect Storm." Mr. Nathan provided an overview of current challenges facing the healthcare system and argued that the nation was unwilling to effect nec-



essary reforms.

In his presentation Mr. Nathan cited a number of disturbing facts that argue for change within the healthcare system, among them being an aging population, an increasing

reliance on government funding, increasing consumer demand for accountability and a lack of political will for reform. We also learned of disturbing health issues such as problems within the Medicare program and national obesity trends.

Mr. Nathan argued for the need to engage in dialogue evaluating the philosophies of universal health care versus survival of the fitness. He also suggested that minor fine tuning was not enough and the urgency of brining special interests groups to the table so we create an American system of healthcare.

He concluded his presentation with an overview of long term trends within our local health care system and efforts being made at creating a true community owned health care system— Community Health Visioning 201`7.

We saw evidence of regeneration of blood vessels using adult stem cells harvested from the person receiving the treatment. As the Regenocyte pamphlet states, the Regenocyte Therapeutic Procedure turns adult stem cells into medicine. They are improving and prolonging the quality of life for people diagnosed with: heart attack, chest pain, poor circulation, leg pain and heart failure.



We heard from Dr. John Iaconne, MD, Executive Director (pictured below) of the Children's Hospital of Southwest Florida. The Hospital, which



opened its doors n 1994 serves all children in Southwest Florida.

The Hospital is a unique, regional resource. Opening with 67 beds, the hospital now provides 106 with additional resources on the way.

The Hospital distinguishes itself in other ways. For example,

the Hospital staffs 50 pediatric sub specialists, a music therapist (only one of two in the entire State of Florida), and 6 child life therapists.

The Hospital has also been designated a regional intensive care unit and cancer care center (the designated Children's Oncology Group Center for Southwest Florida).

Dr. laconne emphasized the importance philanthropy plays in continuing the Hospital's mission and the attempts made at creating a "home" environment for the children as patients. In other words emphasis is placed on the "gentle touch" aspect of medicine.

A Rotarian Profile...Francis Dixon



Frances Dixon became a member of the Bonita Springs Rotary Club in 1994. She has served as the club's World C o m m u n i t y Service Chair for four years

and as a World Community Service Chair for District 6960. She is a multiple Paul Harris fellow, (having been recognized again this past week) a sustaining member, and a Rotary alumna. She has been awarded the District Rotary Foundation Service Award. She has hosted Rotarians from some 20 clubs to a remote northwest region of Guatemala to oversee Rotary/Adopt-a-Village projects.

A veteran traveler, Frances worked her way around the world from the time she left school. Twenty years ago, her lifelong wanderlust focused on Guatemala during the last decade of that country's civil war. She witnessed the profound suffering of the Mayan Indian people and their desperate attempts to survive in the midst of those 36-years of genocidal warfare.

As a result of her experiences, Frances founded Adopt-a-Village in Guatemala in 1991, an international non-profit organization, dedicated to empowering the indigenous people in their quest for improved education, health, and economic conditions. Since then, she has served as a full time volunteer and has been responsible for initiating and managing over 60 major infrastructure projects for the Mayan people. Many of these projects, which directly support the peace process of post-war Guatemala, have been in partnership with Rotary.

The Rotary Regular program was started in 2001 by then President **Bill Oehler**. The objective was to encourage Rotarians from northern clubs, who are seasonal residents, to become part of the club's service and social activities. Now there are 30 Regulars who commonly participate with time and money. **Roger Brunswick** is the "keeper" of the Regulars.

Last Week: Carl McAloose



Steve McIntosh introduced Carl McAloose, Director of Athletics at FGCU. Carl was named to his current post bν President William Merwin in 2000. He has been responsible for building the athletic program at FGCU from the

ground floor including leading the design and development of nearly \$25 in new facilities.

FGCU moved to a full-fledged member of NCAA Divison II just four years after the program began. FGCU started its athletic program with men's and women's golf and tennis in the fall of 2000. Men's and women's basketball and



cross country teams, as well as baseball and softball were added for 2002-03 and volleyball became the 11th sport in the fall of 2004. Women's swimming, men's soccer and women's soccer began play in Fall 2007. The teams have already accumulated 1,000 varsity wins.

The Eagles stepped up to Division I in Fall 2007 and joined the Atlantic Sun Conference. Carl says, "This conference is a great fit for us athletically and academically".

FGCU student-athletes have achieved above a 3.1 GPA in each of the past 14 semesters, and numerous athletes have won national academic awards.

The FGCU Math Program and Elementary Reading Program have been popular with Southwest Florida youngsters, touching the lives of over 10,000 elementary school children in the last five years. During the 2006-07 season FGCU student-athletes participated in over 10,000 hours of community service.

When asked about football, Carl says "It's going to come...but not soon." The difficulties are the high initial cost of start up, including a stadium, the high annual operating costs, and the need to provide additional equivalent women's programs to meet the requirements of Title IX.

Rotarian in the Spotlight

Bill Reed is a Paul Harris Fellow plus 12.



He joined the club in 2004 after several vears as a Ro-Regular. tarv Bill is a founder and Past Presiof the dent Ro-Concord tary Club of Elkhart County, IN. After graduation from Riley High School, South

Bend, IN, Bill attended Purdue University with 12,500 former WWII GI's. Then he joined the Navy to see the world, but ended up assigned to a repair ship which was "welded to the dock."

Bill started on the path to becoming "First Mirror King" in 1970 as a sales representative; then started his own company, Ramco Engineering, manufacturing bus, fire truck, and motor home side view mirrors in 1975. His first great stride in improving mirrors was to replace the traditional plate glass with "first surface chrome glass". This allowed a convex section to be installed increasing the effective area of the mirror by 25% with the same sized head. Next, he was the first in the U.S. to offer an electric remote bus mirror, eliminating the need for each different driver to "jerk" the mirror around for focus. After this, he became known as the premier innovator in automotive mirrors and, in 1991, was nominated as Entrepreneur of the Year in Manufacturing.

Bill and **Deanna** have been married for 45 years. They have a daughter and two grand children. They are extremely proud of their daughter Dee who has now taken over Ramco Engineering. In the past three years she has gained three patents. The latest is for the mounting of a TV camera in the mirror behind the convex glass. The company now has a 60,000 sq. ft. building and more than 50 employees.

Bill says, "When I see a bus, fire truck or motor home on the road, I take pride in the miracle of a business that was born from one idea. This is the opportunity we have in America where anyone can have a dream and succeed. I am so lucky to have a daughter who continues my dream."

Last Week's Program Estero High School Update

George Clover, Principal of Estero High School offered an overview and update of activities going on at the School.

Mr. Clover, the third principal of Estero High School, is in his fourth year of service.



Some highlights of a very interesting and informative talk:

Business participation remains necessary to support certain school activities such as theatre productions. band activities and vearbook. Mr. Clover acknowledged the help and support local businesses

have provided in those areas.

Mr. Clover discussed the overall impact the economy has had on school generally and enrollment specifically. He pointed out that when he assumed responsibility as principal of Estero High School, enrollment was as 2150 students. Current enrollment levels are at 1500 students and he expects enrollment next year to be about 1250 students. This decline in enrollment impacts staffing and the ability to offer electives.

We heard very thoughtful analysis of the process and impact of Florida's Comprehensive Assessment Test (FCAT) and its grading system.

Thanks Mr. Clover for a very insightful presentation.

Last Week's Program Dr. Wilson Bradshaw

.Steve McIntonsh concluded our February speaker series focusing on public education by introducing Dr. Wilson Bradshaw, President of Florida Gulf Coast University.



Dr. Bradshaw offered insight into the growth and development of Florida Gulf Coast University as it becomes a comprehensive public University.

He commented on the strong support people from this region offer the University.

Some highlights—we learned that this Fall enrollment will approximate 10,000 students (65% of FGCU students come this region). The University will offer its first doctoral program in Physical Therapy and seek to grow its School of Engineering.

Dr. Bradshaw also reflected on the impact funding challenges have on the operation of the University. For example, freezing enrollment does not serve FGCU or this region as it disproportionately impacts university access for students within our region.. He asked us to advocate on behalf of the University.

Foundation Grant Award

Last Week's Program Issues in City Government—"DRGR"

Gary Price kicked off our month-long consideration of city government by introducing Barbara Barnes-Buchanan, Assistant City Manager of the City of Bonita Springs. Barbara was joined by Dan DeLisi of



DeLisi and Fitzgerald.

Barbara and Dan offered a presentation focusing on "DRGR" which stands for Density Reduction Groundwater Resource. The DRGR study has been underway for a bout 4 1/2 years. Barbara focused much of her discussion on land use issues related to DRGR.

The process gives rise to many complicated water management issues and has required the coordination of multiple state and local agencies.

Dan Delisi offered a summary of the draft land use studies in place as issues relating to DRGR are reviewed and considered.



Our Foundation Board—An Overview

Editor's Note: Thanks to Dave Shellenbarger, Trustee of our Foundation, for providing this helpful overview of the workings of our Foundation.

Our Club's Foundation acts as the charitable giving arm of the Club, considering all grant requests received from community agencies to support their activities and projects. In the 2006/7 fiscal year the Foundation made over \$80,000 in grants; to date in this fiscal year, grants are in excess of \$40,000. Thorough evaluation of organizations requesting grants is necessary to assure that Club grants achieve the maximum results and bring credit to our Club.

Priority for nomination to the Foundation Board is given to past Club presidents, and then to long term Club members. The purpose of this nominating process is to use the accumulated experience of our members to make the best and wisest decisions on the use of Club monies as we pursue community service. Board terms are for three years, and members can serve two consecutive terms.

Overview Continued

The Club transfers excess monies to the Foundation on a quarterly basis, moving profits from fund raising activities to Foundation management. Gifts to the Foundation are also received from Rotarians and friends of Rotary.

The Foundation has an established investment plan that invests 60% in stocks and 40% in bonds and fixed income investments. The treasurer is responsible to hold enough cash in the checking account to fund grant approvals.

The Foundation maintains an annual giving budget that is circulated to the Club board regularly. Foundation board meetings are held the third Monday of the month, and are open to any Club member who would like to attend.





Last Week's Program Dr. Aswani K. Volety Florida Gulf Coast University



Dr. Aswani Volety, Professor of Marine Science and the Chair of the Department of Marine and Ecological Sciences at Florida Gulf Coast University, offered a very interesting presentation on Marine Science. Dr. Volety pictured above right, with Peter Lefferts, Director of Planned Giving at FGCU, provided an interesting overview of community based restoration of Oyster Reefs in Southwest Florida.

We learned that oysters perform important ecological functions in estuaries, as they are highly efficient at filtering water and providing food for bottom feeders. As such, oyster reefs provide essential refuge and habitat by promoting an efficient ecosystem. Dr. Volety described how FGCU staff and community volunteers help with the restoration of oyster reefs.

Dr. Volety is the lead investigator for a National Award winning project "Oyster Reef Restoration in Southwest Florida" that received the 2006 Coastal America Partnership Award.

presentation on "Fly Fishing."

Frank expertly presented the historical, metaphysical, and sport aspects of fly fishing..



and fund distributor. It encourages collaboration attempting to bring the community together to focus on issues and creating solutions that improve lives.

United Way partners with 70 agencies in the Southwest Florida community. 90% of dollars raised go to program support. Jennylyn provided several testimonials describing her personal and United way's commitment in assisting children, families and other critical needs in Southwest Florida.



Last year United Way raised 7.6 million dollars. United

Way of Lee, Hendry, and Glades Counties was the only United Way last year not only to meet but surpass its goal.

This year's goal is 8 million dollars.

Jennylyn stressed the important work performed by the United Way Partner Agencies. She introduced Jim Brennan of the Literacy Council of Bonita Springs as an example of that collaboration and important work.

Jim Brennan Literacy Council of Bonita Springs



Jim provided an overview of the activities and accomplishments of the Literacy Council of Bonita Springs, one of the partner agencies for the United Way.

As a tutor, Jim teaches classes in the afternoon and the evening and sees the true positive impact on the lives of people the Literacy Council touches as they learn the English language.

2008 marks the 20th anniversary of the Literacy Council. The Council serves almost 1750 students.

565 active tutors teach those students. 281 mothers and their children participate in the Moms and Tots program designed to teach English to the mothers and introduce English to the preschool students. Last August, the Council had its first graduation with 20 students participating in the ceremony.

Jim also updated us on the June 12 groundbreaking for a new building. Once completed, the Literacy Council will have an almost 11,000 square foot building operational by the end of the 2009. The building will have 13 classrooms, a United Way resource center, auditorium, state of the art computer center and library.



This past Wednesday we heard from Melissa Pfeffer, Community Representative of the American Cancer Society, Collier Unit.

Melissa offered some personal reflections and a broad based overview of

the work performed by the American Cancer Society.

The Society's materials describe itself "as the nation's community-based volunteer health organization dedicated to eliminating cancer as a major health concern."

Wednesday's presentation provided sobering information underscoring the important work the Society performs as we learned that annually an estimated 6673 people in our area and more than 100,000 people across Florida are diagnosed with cancer.

Melissa provided some helpful examples of

of the work performed by the Cancer Society in our region.

For example, the Cancer Society serves as an Advocate, seeking to secure funding to build Florida's cancer research infrastructure. In addition, the Cancer Society acts as a resource, through its Road to Recovery Program, providing transportation to and from treatment for cancer patients.

Melissa made reference to the "I Can Cope" and "Man to Man" programs. I Can Cope provides educational classes providing assistance in coping with the challenges of a cancer diagnosis.



Man to Man provides educational and programmatic support for men diagnosed with prostate cancer and their families.





We were introduced to the concept of "real age" as opposed to "calendar age." The focus should be on "real age" as that is a measure of one's health status. (Tammy referred us to the RealAge Test which provides medically valid metrics comparing biological versus calendar age.)

Tammy discussed the implication and importance of resting heart rate, resting blood pressure rate, weight measure (particularly around the waist), muscular strength and endurance, and flexibility.

he a We considered the interrelation between real age and exercise when Tammy described those concepts within a "retirement planning" framework. Stated another way, the goal and point of an exercise regimen now is to allow us of to live longer and better so we can continue to na do the things we want to do well into our seventies and eighties.

as st. Tammy emphasized the importance of walking and strength training.

She suggested that walking is a great way of working physical activity into a regular routine. It does not require expensive equipment and can be done almost anywhere. Research has shown that walking alone gets you 40% of all health benefits of exercise.



Finally, we considered the concept of Strength Training. We were learned the importance of adding strength training to a

walking program.

Strength training helps keep bones healthy and strong and can reduce the risk of injuries associated with osteoporosis by up to 80%. In addition, without resistance exercises, the body replaces 5% of your muscle every 10 years with fat. Strength training just 30 minutes a week can prevent this totally.

Finally, Tammy offered some exercise regimen examples and answered questions.

Chiara proceeded to outline steps we could all atfollow to achieve healthy eating. First, she sugıp gested that we look for ingredients that areal healthy, fresh, and in season. n-

Chiara's presentation introduced us to a food buying discipline. She urged that we do our homework and pick a recipe. As we gather and buy

our ingredients she suggested that we buy organic and locally grown products, including eggs and dairy. A rule of thumb was that of looking at the PLU number on produce-4 digits means it is not organic, 5 digits beginning with a 9 means that it is.

Finally, we were provided some suggestions as to what "to buy" and what "not to buy." Chiara urged us to buy fresh vegetables, beans, lean cuts of meat, wild caught fish, whole grain bakery products and olive oil. She suggested we stay away from sodas, diet sodas and sugaradded drinks and juices, foods high in hydrogenated fats, foods that contain a high number of saturated animal fats, and processed foods.

Last Week's Program "Gift of Life" Steve Agius

This past week we heard a very elegant and inspiring presentation from Steve Agius, past Assistant Governor for our District. Steve's presentation focused on the Gift of Life Program.



Originally founded in 1975,

now more than thirty years later, Gift of Life, with the support of Rotarians worldwide pairs doctors, hospitals and children with life-threatening heart conditions to give these children a second chanced at life.

Steve described how Gift of Life works. Children are identified with cardiac-related or similar health problems in their country. Most often, these children are flown to the United States where a volunteer team of medical professionals perform the life saving surgery. Hospitals where the surgeries are



performed accept a single \$5,000 donation. Gift of Life has now attained a worldwide following where some surgeries are performed in the Middle East and Southeast Asia.

To date, Gift of Life has saved the lives of more than 9000

children.

Steve offered heartfelt and since comments how Gift of Life helps one transition from being a member of a Rotary Club to becoming a Rotarian. The Gift of Life website places Steve's comments in true focus when it notes "this project is a classic example how Rotary can promote peace and understanding between nations through international community service."

All were encouraged to attend. Last Week's Program Joe Schwartzel "Southwest Florida Economic Update"

Last week our speaker chairman for the month of September Mark Lewis introduced Joe Schwartzel.

Joe spoke to our Club about two years ago. At that point he had just finished service as a Director of the South Florida Region of the Federal Reserve Bank.



Currently Joe is responsible for running two local television stations and more than a dozen local radio stations. Those media outlets are involved in helping over 1200 local business advertise.

With those credentials Joe was well equipped to offer some observations on the Southwest Florida economic climate.

Joe began his talk by providing an overview of the broadcast industry in Southwest Florida in which he has been involved for the past 35 years. He has ownership interest in local channels 5 and 6 as well as several local radio stations. He and his business partners bring almost 60 years of broadcast experience to the market.

His partner family—the Mickey McBride Family—was very instrumental in bringing a broadcast infrastructure to Southwest Florida. Mickey McBride bought WINK AM in 1946 for \$100,000; placed WINK TV on the air in 1954 and WINK FM in 1964.

In addition, the McBride family has ties to the Cleveland area. Joe offered several interesting vignettes regarding that family, including their relationship to the Cleveland Browns.

Joe reflected on the creative, technical and public service aspects of the broadcasting industry. He noted that his business is more competitive than ever.

His transition from an analysis of the broadcast business to the state of the Southwest Florida economy began with a consideration of advertising revenue that drives growth and profit in his business. When the economy slows, as it has now, there is great pressure on margins in his business.

As an example of the state of the current market, Joe indicated that the radio market was down 17.7% year to date and television down 11.2%. An even more telling economic indi-

He offered several examples of the need to look at things differently to move the City forward and keep it competitive within the marketplace.



Since that time they have provided him with medical care and two sets of prosthetic limbs for a growing young man. Now almost 19, he is living a active, useful life.

Modern Day Slavery Discussed

"Twenty-seven million people are living in slavery around the world today!"

That was the startling revelation last week by Lowell and Sally Senitz. They lead the non-profit ministry, Safe Houses Interna-

tional. dedicated to intervention in human trafficking. Mr.



introduced by Marj Rubacky. They have spent much of their lives doing missionary work in Germany, Eastern Europe and Africa, and have served on the Board of Directors of Christ Commission for Romania, Inc. for 18 years

Trafficking Victims

Seventy percent of these slavery victims, they said, are women and children.




Approximately 600,000 to 800,000 are trafficked annually across international borders, and between 14,500 and 17,500 into the U.S.

After drug dealing, human trafficking is tied with the illegal arms industry as the second larg-

est criminal industry in the world today, and it is the fastest growing. They said it is a \$35 billion industry, world-wide, and in some countries, governments are involved.

How Victims Are Trafficked

Many are exploited for purposes of commercial sex, including prostitution, pornography and live sex shows. Others are victims of labor exploitation including domestic servitude, sweatshop factories and agriculture.



Safe Houses Making a Difference

The speakers recently returned from a trip into the Sudan, Romania and the Kibera slum of Nairobi, Kenya to intervene in



sex-servitudes slavery of children and women. They told of the establishment of a compound in the Sudan where 450 children are being protected, and of "safe houses" in Kenya and Romania where staff and volunteers are working

to shield women and children from those who would exploit them.

With a home in Southwest Florida where they are involved in the real estate investment business, they have utilized their summer vacations to take supplies to orphans and build ministries to build "safe houses" dedicated to slavery intervention.




