In Memoriam: Rotarian Martha Erickson passed away recently. She was born on May 13, 1921. Martha earned her BS and MS from Michigan State and Purdue University. She and her husband Rick settled in South Bend, Indiana where Rick practiced Pediatrics. Martha formed an auxiliary at Northern Indiana Children's Hospital and helped establish a School for Practi-

cal Nurses. She co-organized the St. Joseph County Scholarship Foundation, and a Planned Parenthood chapter. Martha became involved with the Head Start program in her county and rose to become Director of the Region. She was an adjunct professor of nutrition at Indiana University-South Bend and owner of a Nutrition Counseling company. Martha wrote Eat for the Health of It (1997). Rick and Martha moved to Bonita Springs in 1990. She was a member of First Presbyterian Church of Bonita Springs, The Rotary Club of Bonita Springs, the Junior League of Northern Indiana and First Presbyterian Church of South Bend.



Brenda Brooks, Executive Director of CREW, informed us that CREW is a very large and complex project. CREW stands for Corkscrew Regional Ecosystem Watershed, established in 1989 with 60,000 acres. The objective of CREW is to preserve and protect that

watershed through education and land acquisition no Government agency could have come together to purchase this land that spans from Lee to Collier, from Corkscrew to Immokalee. There are 5 miles of hiking and biking trails, primitive camping, geocaching, and educational programs.


