.In Memoriam

Richard B. Fredrickson 1926-2018 Dick Fredrickson passed away Thursday afternoon. He was a 28 year Rotarian and served as Club President 2006-07.

Dick and his late wife Kathy moved to Estero in 1996. He became very active in the First Presbyterian Church, Rotary, and civic associations. He liked participating and contributing to his community and enjoyed taking leadership positions in many different organizations during his lifetime..

Dick graduated from the University of Wisconsin with a degree in Mechanical Engineering in 1945. After a short tour of sea duty in the Pacific, he married and, in 1946, joined Cincinnati Milacron, a machine tool manufacturer located in Cincinnati, Ohio.

Dick spent the next several years in sales with different territorial, regional, division and overseas assignments. In 1974, he became Product Manager of the company's newest venture, a machine to make the plastic carbonated beverage bottles that became a standard in the industry.
