Jeff told us about the newly opened school that has NO BOOKS, NO LOCKERS, and no SCHOOL ZONE signs. The school now has 680 students. freshman and sophomores. The sophomores spent last year as freshman in portable classrooms at

Estero H.S.

Jeff showed us safety and security features designed into the campus. There is only one entrance to the school building and one car access route.

Among the features of the school are an auditorium where the seats can be stored to allow the space to be used for other activities.

disciplines puts the students in an advanced position when graduating. The FGCU academy is the top tracker among the students.

Jeff says the community has really stepped forward to support the school. 2,000 people came out to watch the team's first JV football game. A group from Bonita Bay contributed \$150,000 for student activities and **Brad** and **Melissa Piotrowski** have taken the responsibility for organizing an athletic boosters program.

The kids take good care of their laptops which they use instead of paper books. Although the student population is 62% hispanic, the kids are fluent in English. There are fewer than 20 students in ESL programs.

In Lee County all students are eligible for free breakfast and lunch.

Jeff wants to have the school busy from 6 am to 10 pm. New Horizons will begin offering after school tutoring programs at the facility for elementary, middle, and high school kids and he is looking forward to having night school and adult education programs.
