Last Week Program

Our program speaker this week was attorney **Amy Garrard**. Amy's firm is *AG Employment Law PLLC*. She spoke about "Bully-Proofing Your Organization", told us about bullying in general, and described related Florida Law.

She explained that bullying is unwelcome behavior that occurs over a period of time and is meant to harm someone who feels powerless to respond.

She said that a 2017 survey found that 61% were aware of bullying in the workplace; 19% had experienced bullying; and 19% had witnessed bullying.

Amy pointed out that workplace bullying could provide:

Basis for an emotional distress claim:

Negative effect on morale; Decrease productivity; Increase health care costs.

Her presentation was well received with several members waiting to talk with her at the end of the meeting.
