Fred Fung, CEO and General Manager of the Bonita Bay Club was our speaker Wednesday. He told us of his goal of being in the hospitality industry at an early age and of some of his early adventures in the business. Now he manages an operation with \$92 million as-

sets, 5 golf courses, 3 driving ranges, 1 short game practice area, 8 pickle ball courts, 2 croquet courts, and a 60,000 sq ft life style building. The are about 3,600 people members and his job is "..to ensure that they have a meaningful experience".

Fred was the assistant general manager 10 years ago, left. and returned as general manager. There are currently 550 employees of the club. He noted that there are a lot of long time members in the club and many of the senior managers are long time employees.
