Last Week Speaker

Marjorie Rubacky introduced Bonnie Whittemore President of the Bonita Springs Historical Society. Bonnie was brought up on a large, Ohio farm and got her college degree and pilot's license in Boston. She worked for Digital Equipment Corp and HP as a project and program manager.

Bonnie retired to Bonita in 2002. She became interested in the history of the city and in researching how Bonita became such a well-rounded, small city.

The Historical Society is working with the City's Preservation Board trying to preserve and protect historical documents and places. She believes the city needs to have a small museum to store and display historical documents so the history is not lost.

For instance, in 1891, the Johnson family purchased Mound Key receiving a deed signed by President Benjamin Harrison. Johnson family descendants have been a great source of information.

Bonnie says that trying to discover and put together history has been "fun for me". She told us of famous movies that used the WonderGarden as a backdrop; the first bank opening in 1963; the first swamp buggy; and the infamous Dome Restaurant. And there is a 72 pound meteorite in the Smithsonian in D.C. known as the Bonita Springs Meteorite.

She is enthusiastic about her project to get a small museum. "We need to work hard with the City, the Preservation Board, and other organizations to try to get a museum to display the history of Bonita."
