Last Week Program



Our Rotary Regular Diane Ewing from the Centreville, MD Rotary Club introduced the Lifetime Wells program. **Kenny Wood**, also a member of the club, is the owner of Lifetime Well Drilling Company. He and his firm have drilled a high percentage of the water wells in eastern Maryland and western Delaware.

In 2006, he got involved in a project to drill wells in Ghana and Tanzania Africa. Prior to the wells, women and children would walk up to 2 miles to the nearest source of water. The water was terribly contaminated, resulting in widespread disease, sickness, and death. since then he has drilled more than 2,500 water wells in Africa.

In the course of working with the villagers in Africa, Ken became aware of widespread eye problems caused by excessive sun exposure and poor nutrition. To address these problems, he has financed 2,450 cataract operations, nearly 6,000 pairs of prescription eye glasses, and over 2,500 eye disease treatments.

The Rotary Foundation is partnering with the Centreville club to drill more than 15 wells, bringing clean drinking water to over 10,000 people. Any donation will be matched by TRF. A form with information and details is attached (only on the emailed Spoke).
