
Help us to understand and accept responsibility associated with chosen behavior.

Report on Gift of Life

Several weeks ago, **Ron Anderson** gave a brief presentation regarding the Rotary Gift of Life (GOL) program. Ron is a member of the Florida GOL board of directors.

GOL has been providing **hope** to children with heart disease and **healing** little hearts around the world since 1975. Each year, 1.3 million children are born with congenital heart disease, and 93% are born in country that cannot care for them.

At first, children were brought to the U.S. for treatment. In 2009, GOL initiated the "Our Hearts are in." program focused on developing sustainable pediatric cardiac programs in select emerging countries.

Together with like-minded partners, GOL has created such centers in Uganda and El Salvador, while
