PresentationsHerb Barnes Heart of Rotary Award



Last Week Program

Steve McIntosh started his introduction with a forecast of FGCU accomplishments in the next 25 years. Then he introduced **Dr. Michael Martin, PhD**, who became FGCU's fourth president on July 1, 2017.



Mike is retiring at the end of the year. He thinks the search for his replacement will be complicated by the number of open college president's jobs in the southeast. The search will be conducted by a Trustees committee and a professional search firm. The university also needs to replace a number of academicians who were hired 25 years ago and are ready to retire.

Other tidbits from Mike:

He reported that FGCU now has **16,000 students**. It has grown slightly during the Covid years while many others have lost enrollment.

The residences are 97% occupied. A healthy occupancy rate.

The university is planning to have in-person graduations this year. The size of Alico Arena and it's limited access roads will make this a difficult planning and execution issue.

FGCU is in the ASUN Athletic Conference. The Conference is expanding with new teams far from SWFL creating difficult travel problems for FGCU athletes.

"AB9" **A**cademic **B**uilding Number 9 being constructed for **The** (Donor?) **Water School** is behind schedule. They are looking for a donor who would like to get his name between **The** and **Water**.

The Entrepreneurship school has new building.

FGCU's Nursing School graduates are very successful when taking licensing exams.

Martin doesn't subscribe to the thinking that universities only graduate liberals. He pointed to FGCU grads who are now very conservative elected officials. Ron DeSantis is a graduate of Yale and Harvard Law, schools that are often thought of as bastions of liberalism.

Martin points out the Critical Race Theory has been part of the curriculum at most law schools since 1977. He decried attempts to limit student's exposure when the objective is to develop intelligent graduates able to make their own decision.


